## **OWNING A FARM - CAN DREAMS COME TRUE?** By Karin Worm

Having ridden and boarded horses on two continents for many years, the idea of having horses at home was going through my mind rather frequently. But I thought if you have your horses at home you also need a place to ride them, which means some acreage is necessary. Then, what to do in winter? An indoor is an awfully nice thing and that makes it more complicated. So I kept on dreaming, discussing and dreaming some more... until I made the decision to go for it!

The next step was to find people that shared my dream and were willing to take a risk, contribute expertise, and put in the hard work required to make that dream come true. (Lisa, I could never have done it without you!) We got lucky and found the right place to make it all happen (thanks to Joanne). So after many years of solitary and collective dreaming, we came across a working horse farm for sale in Jackson. Previously, as Buddy Brook and Presidio Farm housing mostly hunter jumpers, it had everything we were looking for, indoor and outdoor rings, numerous paddocks, trails, and lots of stalls (how many you ask?... 40. What forty? Like in four-zero? ...Yup!) So we dreamers sat down, ran the numbers, projected, and planned, since we wanted to do everything right. An LLC was formed, letters exchanged, lots of paperwork signed, and the farm changed hands on September 1, 2013.

Even though things were in working order and in pretty good shape, the indoor was very dark. Oh, no problem, we can just add windows to the short side in front and back and while we are at it we can add some more windows to the first barn and the doors as well (\$\$\$\$). And, we should also get new footing for the indoor and a new tractor to take care of said footing (more \$\$\$\$). We also learned to have an ample supply of fence posts and planks handy, enough buckets and feed tubs, large water containers for the paddocks (19 of them to be exact) and there are never enough brooms and shovels and muck buckets around, not to mention cross ties, lead ropes, and double-ended snaps (even more \$\$\$\$). I had to learn a lot about horse feed options, and after ample research and consultations with feed suppliers and an equine nutritionist (thank you Carrey), along with the help of my "co-conspirator" and resident trainer, Lisa Basselini, I now know the difference between grass hay, orchard mix, and alpha-alpha, and can distinguish among pelleted, texturized, and fibergized feed. Then, there was the manure thing and the waste management plan required by NJ law. And does anybody know how to work QuickBooks?

All obstacles mastered, Jersey Palms Farm was officially open for business on November 1, 2013. Why Jersey Palms, you ask? I always wanted to retire surrounded by palm trees, but that looks pretty unlikely, so I will plant palm trees where it looks like I am going to retire (wait and see).

Even though I have never in my life signed as many four- and five-figure checks (and this seems to be an ongoing process), being able to ride in your very own indoor any time you want is definitely priceless.

Thanks to the trust and support of an amazing group of people, friends, boarders, and Lisa's loyal students it looks like this could actually work! For anyone else thinking of taking the plunge and opening their own farm, think carefully about what that involves, but know that it's definitely possible and dreams can come true.

## Fix-a-Test Clinics

To help you get ready for the show season, we are offering three fix-a-test clinics around our membership area. At a fix-a-test clinic, the participant rides the dressage test of his/her choice, and a judge scores it just like at a horse show. The judge will then work with the rider to improve upon the test, and the rider can then ride the test again. The rider will receive a copy of both of their tests. This format is a great way to learn how to improve your scores and to hear and see how a judge arrives at a score for each movement. We also have an hour lunch discussion with the judge clinician. We encourage all youth to attend as riders or auditors and to plan to audit the entire day. Participants and all-day auditors will receive 10 credits towards the Youth Educational Award. 



## **SPORT HORSE CRUISE**

## THE NON-DECISION

After nearly a year of planning, my parents, my mare Eve, and I all headed down to Aiken, SC. I was looking forward to a few months stint as a working student for 4-star eventers Jess Hampf and her fiancé Doug Payne. The promise of warmer weather and immersing myself in the world of horses 16 hours a day, 6 or 7 days a week had me drooling for months in anticipation. That was three weeks ago and a few things have happened since then.

The trip down was not as expected. Winter storm Janus came further inland and earlier than predicted by the forecasts we were relying on. We had snow from just into Pennsylvania all the way through Virginia. Travel in West Virginia was treacherous with several inches of snow on the highway. Towing an over-sized trailer through snow over miles and miles of invisible interstate was not fun. The word from the local at the gas station was that West Virginia pre-treats their roads rather than plowing. I'm sure that the drivers of the dozens of vehicles that we saw that had slid off the interstate would have strong opinions about the pre-treating policy of that state. The snow continued through Virginia, but the roads were in much better condition. Our Suburban got a nice thank you pat once we finally arrived.

Eve and I easily settled into Jess's family's beautiful farm in Bridle Creek, and the next several days were relatively uneventful. However, a rare winter snowstorm then deposited a few inches of snow in the area. At home, it would have been considered a nuisance. Down there, it almost stopped the clocks. It melted soon and things were back to normal for the next day. They were normal for several more days. The days were full, but fun and I entered my first event of the season.

The norm decided to take another beak. On February 12, a very heavy ice storm hit Aiken head on. Trees snapped like twigs. Wires came down and transformers blew as if they had learned how to create havoc from their northern counterparts during Sandy. We, and thousands of others, lost power. We thought we were in relatively good shape since we had a generator; then it failed. At least we had gas for cooking. The horse trial we were entered in at Paradise Farm on Friday rescheduled its riders to show on Saturday and Sunday along with the competitors who had signed up for the 2-day trial. By Friday night, I was desperate for a shower. I visited newly found friends from USC and took advantage of their running water. A funny thing happened while I was in the shower: we had a 4.4 magnitude earthquake!

At least the weather on the weekend was wonderful and conditions for the event were terrific. While driving to the trial on Sunday, I called my mother, using Bluetooth, as my phone charged all the way. We chatted about the challenges and discomforts of a prolonged power outage. She casually asked me if I wanted to come home. My answer was never in doubt, but just for giggles, I weighed the pros and cons of present day life in Aiken versus New Jersey.

Home Base: Toy Box Farm (NJ) vs. The Hampf farm (SC) are both fabulous.

Entertainment: Cable and internet (NJ) vs. playing cards via flashlight with friends (SC). Friends are a lot more fun than computers.

Bedtime: Toasty due to working heat (NJ) vs. a bit chilly due to power outage (SC). This was a great excuse to borrow friends' dogs to act as bed-warmers.

Driving thrills: Dodging massive car eating potholes (NJ) vs. dodging dangling or downed tree limbs and wires (SC).

View from my bedroom: The cul-de sac that hasn't changed in my 18 years (NJ) vs. two dressage rings and a cross country course (SC).

Schooling focus: Perfection of the 20M circle (NJ) vs. cross-country combinations (SC).

My Skin: Rudolph nose and chapped lips (NJ) vs. a farmer's tan (SC).

Fashion: The pressure to look good in multiple, coordinated layers (NJ) vs. the excuse to be "casual" due to a prolonged power outage (SC).

The list could go on and on, but it doesn't matter. Eve and I just had a great time at our first event of 2014. The challenges presented because of the current conditions are just adventures that I wouldn't leave for anything. I'll see you in the spring!

## HORSE TREATS by Meredith Rogers

Our country was founded on the back of a horse, so it was only appropriate that horses made their way into the White House. Ever since George Washington, our Presidents have utilized, enjoyed, and admired the magnificent horse.



The original White House stables were built in 1800 by Thomas Jefferson as a simple Georgian brick building. The stables burned down in 1864 with President Lincoln's son's pony inside; Lincoln ran into the burning building in an attempt to save the pony but unfortunately, could not. In 1871, Ulysses S. Grant commissioned a high Victorian, mansard-roofed stable in that was expanded in 1891 to stall 25 horses, a carriage house, tack and harness rooms, and a living area for stable staff. The end of the horse era came in 1909 when President Taft converted the stable into a garage for his large steam cars. The stables were demolished two years later.

The role of horses at the White House has also changed, going from utilitarian work machines and transportation to a good use of leisure time. President Taylor's war veteran horse, Old

Whitey, helped to mow the lawns from 1849-1850. President Grant was known to go on mad dashes with his trotters along Pennsylvania Avenue, and he even received a speeding ticket while trying to race a delivery van (the delivery van was able to keep up, so President Grant bought the horse pulling it). President Teddy Roosevelt did a lot of pleasure riding, and if you were invited to join him, you had to follow his Rules of the Road. The entire Roosevelt family loved horses so much that one of the sons decided to bring his pony upstairs in the White House elevator to cheer up his brother who was ill. When he was offered a car, President Roosevelt said, "The Roosevelts are horse people." President Taft didn't have much luck with horses, which is probably why he fell under the spell of the automobile, and President Coolidge was allergic but had a mechanical horse built for exercise. Subsequent Presidents had to enjoy horses on their home properties; President Johnson had a ranch in Texas, and President Reagan had one in California. The Kennedy's pony, Macaroni, was normally housed in Virginia but made frequent visits to the White House, where he was often allowed to freely roam the grounds.
