THE JOURNEY IS THE AWARD

I achieved a long-time goal of mine last year, but instead of feeling overjoyed, I'm feeling a little underwhelmed. I think it's because the journey to get here has been more of an accomplishment than the award itself. It may be silly, but ever since I bought my horse 3.5 years ago, I've wanted a USDF All Breed Award. I thought it would be quite doable, since there weren't many horses competing in his declared breed: Georgian Grande. But, I hadn't taken into consideration all of the obstacles along the way.

First, I had bought a horse barely at Training Level whose fitness was sorely lacking. It took an entire year to get him strong enough to canter without throwing himself into it with his front end because he didn't have the strength in his hind end. Second, my riding ability should have been paired with a schoolmaster who could teach me how to properly get a horse into contact or what correct bend felt like; but no, I fell in love with a green bean. Thankfully, he has the disposition of a saint. However, because we are discovering this thing called "dressage" together, progress has been slow but at least it has been in the right direction.

Third, getting to shows took feats in scheduling to be able to finagle rides from friends and barn mates. Therefore, our show experience was limited to the occasional schooling show, which didn't help my horse learn to deal with all of the things that go with showing (eg, judges stands, strange horses passing too close for comfort, spectators in dark corners, etc.) or me learn to deal with how my horse reacted to these changes in venue.

This year, after two years of acceptable scores at schooling shows, I was ready to take the plunge into USEF Recognized Competition and go for it. The first thing I did was get a truck and trailer. My old car was on its last wheel anyway. During this year, I've figured out how to drive the rig both forwards and backwards (sort-of). I even drove home in the dark from my last horse show. I can now load and unload my horse by myself, something which had been an issue in the past. Although I haven't had to go it totally alone thanks to my nonhorsey husband and a great group of friends, I feel confident that I could get my horse and I to a show, get through the competition in one piece (with a straight stock tie), and home again by myself if I had to.

To get a USDF All Breed Award, one needs to have 8 scores with median of 60% from 4 judges at 4 shows. Living in a very equestrian part of the country I didn't think this would be a problem, but it was. To get to 4 separate shows without repeat judges, I had to travel further than I had gone for a show in a long time, to places I had never been before. I had never done a 2-day dressage show before, but this

year I did in order to get enough scores. I learned I never want to do that again! It was stifling hot for several of the shows, so I had to figure out how best to warm-up my horse before trotting down center line when both of us just really wanted to lounge in the shade. This year also solidified my philosophy that the horse comes first, when I scratched a show because it was just too hot for him. Of course, that left me scrambling at the end of the season to find a fourth show to attend.

With my riding, I took the judge's comments to heart, and in between competitions, I worked with my trainers to fix what needed to be fixed and improve upon our strengths. Both my horse and I have improved by leaps and bounds, and I credit it to the push of needing to get those scores. I've learned to trust my horse more, since he behaved himself despite the adrenaline show environment. I also have more confidence in myself as a result of me realizing that I'm not as bad of a rider as I thought I was.

I do admit that I'm happy show season is over for us — it was a lot of pressure. But, I've been inspired to continue on. Next year it will be back to schooling shows, but (hopefully) at first level. And, maybe in another year or two, we'll try again for a national USDF award, or maybe Regional Championships, or just going to a bigger show than we've ever gone to before. I can see a long, but fulfilling, road ahead of us.

Dear Show Managers:

The Horse Park of New Jersey wanted to give each an update of work underway for the preparation of the 2014 show season. The Facilities Committee, Board of Directors and staff are dedicated in improving the entire facility including the competition arena and warm up rings.

During the fall and winter work has been completed on repairing and improving drainage outside the competition areas so that the surrounding runoff can be managed and diverted away from the rings. During the early spring, drainage around the outside of the East Ring will be addressed so water can be drained more effectively away from the ring. Planning is underway on the warm up ring to address corrective actions on the slope and footing in that arena.

Also this spring, as weather permits, the competition arenas will be graded, leveled and the footing managed where needed in order to maintain suitability for the vast types of disciplines and riders that utilize the arenas.

The Facilities Committee and Staff are looking at various methods of ring maintenance and equipment so that the rings can be better maintained throughout the year. The park has acquired two new Parma Ring Conditioners to add to the types of equipment available and is looking into a smaller tractor to be used in working the rings more effectively. Specialized arena grooming for each event prior to, during and post events will be a high priority of the Horse Park.

In the future the vision of the Horse Park of New Jersey is to move toward being the Equine Destination Venue not just for the state but for the region, encompassing all types of equine competitions. In order to accomplish one part of this goal the Trustees are underway in the establishment of a capital campaign for arena footing, drainage and renovations. An honorary chairman will soon be publicly announced with the kick-off of the campaign.

Thank you to all for considering and utilizing the Horse Park of New Jersey for your equine event now and in the future

Fix-a-Test Clinics

To help you get ready for the show season, we are offering two more fix-a-test clinics around our membership area. At a fix-a-test clinic, the participant rides the dressage test of his/her choice, and a judge scores it just like at a horse show. The judge will then work with the rider to improve upon the test, and the rider can then ride the test again. The rider will receive a copy of both of their tests. This format is a great way to learn how to improve your scores and to hear and see how a judge arrives at a score for each movement. We also have an hour lunch discussion with the judge clinician. We encourage all youth to attend as riders or auditors and to plan to audit the entire day. Participants and all day auditors will receive 10 credits towards the Youth Educational Award.

Team Selection Deadlines Right Around the Corner!

It's time to start thinking about representing the ESDCTA in team competitions. Last year our selected team members were very successful, had a great time working as members of a team, and learned a lot. Everyone went away with a positive experience!

This year we are sending teams to compete at Lendon Gray's Youth Dressage Festival (LGYDF) (July 11-13), the USDF Region 1 Youth Dressage Team Competition (July 26-27), the Millbrook Horse Trials Team Competition (July 31-Aug. 3), and the Team Challenge at Burgundy Hollow Horse Trials (Sept. 28).

If you are accepted as a member of a team, ESDCTA pays your entry fees (for team classes/divisions) and stabling fees.

Team applications are available on the ESDCTA website: esdcta.org. All applicants must have 8 volunteer hours and have met the criteria outlined in the ESDCTA Omnibus. If you have any questions, do not hesitate to contact one of the youth co-chairs.

Deadlines for Team Applications:





HORSE TREATS by Meredith Rogers

We all know that celebrities are not like us. They drive fancy cars, live in mansions, and have paparazzi following them wherever they go. But did you also know that some of them share our passion for horses? Here's a brief rundown on some famous people who ride (or at least own horses).

Chef Bobby Flay owns Thoroughbred racehorses, and he's an active fundraiser for the Thoroughbred Retirement Foundation, raising hundreds of thousands of dollars. He was just selected at the recipient of the Earle I. Mack Thoroughbred Champion Award, given for outstanding efforts and influence on Thoroughbred racehorse welfare, safety, and retirement to be awarded June 6 as part of the Belmont Stakes Celebration.

Toby Keith, the country singer, also owns and breeds Thoroughbred race horses at his 160-acre Dream Walkin' Farm in Oklahoma. He owns about 20-30 broodmares, and keeps between 15 and 20 horses in training. His farm has a 4-stall barn, a seven-eighths-mile training track with a starting gate, and an indoor walker.

Jillian Michaels, fitness guru, owns (and actually rides) a Friesian-cross named, Buzz. When she was a child, she had an Appaloosa-Thoroughbred that her father sold out from under her when her parents got divorced. How horrible!

Supermodel Gisele Bundchen first learned to ride a horse in Brazil at her aunt's farm when she was just 8 years old. Her first ride was a bit exciting – a cowboy put her on a "very tall gelding" and then swatting him on the rump, which prompted him to take off. She loved every minute of it. When she has time, she rides at her cabin in upstate New York.

You may have heard that Madonna was injured when she fell off of a horse, not once, but twice (in 2005 and 2009). It was her 47th birthday in 2005 when she was presented with a new horse. She got on and within a minute was thrown, breaking 8 bones. In 2009, she fell while riding in the Hamptons. Although she said she had nightmares about the first incident, she still rides.

Comedian Chevy Chase rides Icelandic horses (remember, he's 6'4" – that must be a sight as these horses average about 14 hh). He says he gained his love of horses from his grandfather, a renowned equestrian portraitist.

Joe Perry, Aerosmith guitarist, and his wife own Friesians at their farm in Vermont. He is also very involved in animal charities, supporting the Sea Shepherd Conservation Society that protects marine mammals, and he assisted in funding a new animals shelter in his hometown of Duxbury, Massachusetts.
