PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

I was somewhat prepared when Superstorm Sandy hit and hit hard. After Hurricane Irene and the Great Halloween Snowstorm of 2011, I had the foresight to save enough water for my barn for about a week and maybe 3 days in my house. I was trying to be optimistic.

What I got instead was 10 days without electricity, which meant no water, heat, refrigerator...

When Sandy left us reeling without all the comforts of modern civilization, I don't have to tell all of you that there was no generator to be had from New Jersey to Philly to Syracuse to Massachusetts. I know because, having a kid in every one of those places, I found out all too quickly that my great idea of having them buy us one was the great idea of many. Home Depots in Philly - not hit hard by the storm at all - answered their phones by saying, "We have no generators. Home Depot, how can I help you?"

We finally lucked out on Day 5 after leaving a Tractor Supply parking lot filled with almost a hundred people who had received numbers for a shipment of generators about to roll in. The Sears just up the road put out a sign: "Sears has generators!"

It did not last long and we were, luckily, 15 in line. The generator was large enough to help with a few things in the house, though still no water. If you can find humor at a time like this, we certainly did. The generator weighed 180 pounds. Trying to get that thing out of our truck and near our house was back-breaking but comical. With none of our usual electricians answering our call for help, our new barn help offered up that her father is an electrician and could come over and hook up the generator to the house. Manna from heaven! Water! No one cared, at this point, that it was cold.

As you all know, it was countless hours on line at the gas stations to get gas for the generator in gas cans, which also were sold out everywhere. I have to say, that while we first groaned about the gas rationing, it definitely helped with the lines and getting gas. My boarders with license plates having odd numbers versus our even numbers were able to get us gas on the off days. We had good friends, like Jill Kuc and family, who offered to take the horses if things did not get better.

Then it was all about rebuilding our fence lines. My son came from Philly to help my husband, and we borrowed an electric augur from our horse friends to hook up to our tractor's PTO. We had a huge task: every pasture had suffered multiple post damage. I was very grateful that I have a great crew of horses currently that are content to stay in their pastures and that can read because "Caution" tape filled in the gaps between broken down posts and rails.

The bottom line is we survived and learned that the most terrible thing was not loss of TV or computers. People died, people suffered damage to their homes and businesses, and people are still rebuilding their lives. The lines at the gas stations reminded me of pictures I have seen about the Great Depression. While life was surely difficult, we had our lives first and foremost, as well as food and shelter.

I hope, as we enjoy this holiday season, we remember those who are less fortunate than us, not only as a result of Sandy but year-round, year after year. May you be safe and surrounded by family and friends as you celebrate your holidays.

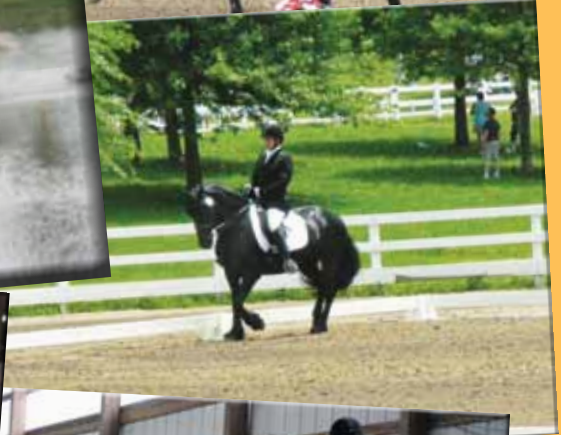
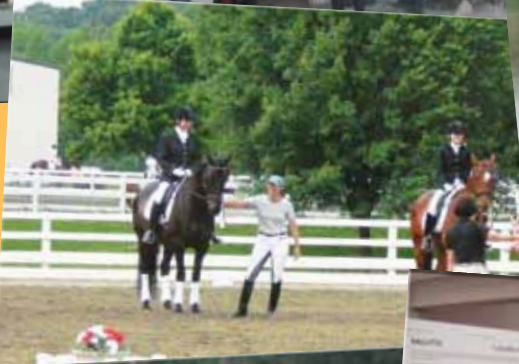

A Reminder to Renew!

Hurricane Sandy Pushes Membership Dues Deadline to December 15

We understand that everyone has been dealing with the aftermath of Superstorm Sandy so we are extending the membership dues deadline to receive your free Omnibus from December 1 to December 15. Your application was included in your September Collective Remarks newsletter. An application also is on the web site: www.esdcta.org.

We have made a few changes to dues for 2013, as outlined in previous articles. Here's a recap:

• **DUES STRUCTURE**

To ensure that members continue to receive the many benefits ESDCTA already provides, the Board voted to raise dues. We have kept the increase nominal. Last year we subsidized the USDF increase so our members were not burdened with the total increase. The new dues structure eliminates that subsidy. The Senior membership dues are now \$55, Family Memberships are \$65 and Youth Memberships are \$45. These increases are only about \$3 in each category. The board did its research when making this consideration, comparing our dues structure to other GMOS and benefits. In comparison to other GMOs, ESDCTA offers many benefits and is very reasonable with its dues.

• **NEW! SUPPORTING MEMBER CATEGORY**

The Board also decided to try a new, experimental membership level for people who do not care to compete in the ESDCTA Championships and apply for ESDCTA year-end awards. For \$40, they can enjoy most member benefits minus the newsletter, which they can download on line a month later, and the Omnibus, which they can purchase for \$15. This provides a savings to both the member who is not interested in year-end awards, and to ESDCTA, which can cut costs associated with the printing of the newsletter and the Omnibus. We have many members who feel this is a welcome opportunity to continue to support the organization.

• **YOUTH MEMBER AGE CHANGE**

The date for a youth member has also changed, defining the age limit for a youth member as a person who has not yet reached his or her 21st birthday by the December 1 start of the new membership year. This is in keeping with the USDF, so there no longer is any conflict with the requirements between ESDCTA and the national organization.

• **NEW! BUSINESS MEMBER PACKAGE**

If you are a business wanting to reach our 700-plus members, our new business member package is \$150 a year. Businesses receive an ad in the newsletter, a listing on the web site, and a listing in the Omnibus. They also receive the newsletter mailed to their business, discounts for advertising, events, and programs that other members receive, and a free Omnibus if they renew by the December deadline. With our new web site opportunities and Omnibus advantages, this new structure should provide an excellent marketing package for the businesses that support our organization.

Named the Sara Dubinin Scholarship, in memory of Sara Dubinin, who loved horses, it will be presented at the New Jersey Bred Equine Breeder Awards Luncheon on January 27, 2013, At Charley's Other Brother Restaurant in Eastampton. Sara, a Sayreville resident, graduated from Cardinal McCarrick High School in South Amboy in 2006. The 19-year-old was attending Middlesex County College when she succumbed to injuries suffered in a motor vehicle accident in September of 2007. Those interested in receiving the scholarship must submit an application form including an essay on, "How horses have affected my life and how horses figure into my future." DIRECTIONS FROM FLEMINGTON CIRCLE:

South on Route 202/31 South. About 3.5 miles from the circle, you will pass Stewart's Root Beer on the right hand side. Copper Hill Road is the second right past Stewart's. Before the traffic light, you will see a sign "Copper Hill Road Keep Right". Veer off onto the jug handle, turn right at the yield sign and follow down the hill. You will see the Clubhouse on your right hand side. To get to the parking lot, go half way around the circle and turn right at the stop sign.

From South Jersey: - Routes 295, 195, or 95 to Route 31 North. Stay on 31 North until it joins with 202 North. Exit onto 202/31 North. Follow approximately 3 miles to light at Copper Hill Road. Take jug-handle on right. Cross 202/31 North onto Copper Hill Road. Follow road up to Clubhouse at top of hill on right.

From North Jersey: - Route 80 East or West to Route 287 South to the Somerville Circle. Follow signs for Route 202 South to Flemington. At the Flemington 202/31 Circle continue halfway around onto Route 202 South. Proceed approximately 3 miles through the traffic light at Stewart's Root Beer. Turn right just before the next light onto Copper-Hill Road. Follow road up to Clubhouse at top of hill on right.

IDHSNA USEA Future Event Horse Educational Seminar

I was lucky to be able to attend the first IDHSNA USEA Future Event Horse Educational Seminar recently held at Hilltop Farm in Colora, Maryland on October 27-28, 2012. Lucky for several reasons: first, that Susan Graham White just happened to mention it to me when I scribed for her at the Dressage at Stone Tavern show on Labor Day weekend; second, that it was within daily driving distance from my home in central New Jersey; and third, that the information covered was so interesting and captivating.

The seminar was scheduled over two packed days. Saturday started with a slide show on conformation by Judy Wardrope. Judy has more than 30 years experience observing top-performing horses in the Olympic disciplines of dressage, jumping, and eventing. Over this time, she has developed a successful assessment system using specific conformational areas to determine athletic potential in the horse. Her lecture was informative and flowed into the next portion of her presentation: application of these conformational principles on live horses. Hilltop Farm provided a great variety of potential athletes for us to view, as Judy evaluated them. I was left with the desire to run home and analyze my own horses using her assessment tools.

The next scheduled portion was a free-jumping demonstration. Michael Bragdell, Faith Fessenden, and Robin Walker led the discussion on style, form, and format. A jumping chute was set along one side of the indoor arena, and we were able to observe a variety of horses performing the drills. Comments were made on attitude, type, and form. I had previously observed the jumping test at a KWPN keuring, but this demonstration made me understand better how to conduct a free-jumping session and how assessments are made. I felt more confident that I could set up a chute at home and perform free-jumping training sessions for my own horses.

The remainder of the first afternoon was occupied with a mock under-saddle class for 3-year-olds and the application of the proposed future event horse class score sheet. Both Susan Graham White, an FEI "I" eventing judge, a USEF "R" dressage judge, and a "r" DSHB sport horse judge; and Faith Fessenden, a jury member of the KWPN-NA for their breeding inspections and a USEF dressage sport horse breeding judge, gave their scores and assessments for the five lovely young horses that were presented for us to consider and evaluate.

Hilltop Farm also thrilled us all with a presentation of their stallions in the indoor arena. Riverman, the third-highest USEF ranked eventing sire, was the grand finale.

The Sunday schedule was organized around practical applications of the theory and knowledge covered on Saturday with an emphasis on trying to end ahead of schedule due to pending hurricane Sandy. The morning sessions centered on the principles of future event horse judging. Since there were many USDF judges in the group, the differences between dressage sport horse breeding judging and future event horse judging were stressed. A group of youngsters at varying stages of development—yearling, 2-year-old, and 3-year-old—was presented, with a discussion on maturity and conformational and structural development for each age.

Michael Bragdell and Hilltop Farm staff held a session on show preparation and handling the young horses on the triangle. I was amazed at how well behaved the group of young horses used for this demonstration were. Overall, all of the demonstration horses were beautifully turned-out and well-behaved. HORSE TREATS

I don't know about you, but I celebrate my horse every day. It seems I am not alone. There are festivals dedicated to the horse all over the world. Below is only a handful.

In the village of Litang in the Sichuan province of China is the Litang Horse Festival, generally held during the first week of August. During the festival, Tibetan horses are raced and other skills of horsemanship are tested.

The Jerez Horse Fair in Spain takes place in the beginning of May and dates back more than 500 years when it was a livestock show. There are a variety of events, including fancy dress, polo, high school dressage, carriage competitions, international show jumping, vaulting, flamenco shows, and workshops, as well as bullfights and sherry tastings.

In March is the Dubai International Horse Fair, which is the region's biggest trade fair and exhibition for leisure and professional riders, owners, stables, and clubs.

County Galway in Ireland has been home to the Ballinasloe International October Fair and Festival that celebrates all things equestrian since 1722. The festival highlights every breed of horse and pony native to Ireland, plus there are dog shows, street stalls, fireworks, tug-o-war, parades, arts & crafts, and other events. It attracts 65,000 visitors each year.

The Verona Horse Fair takes place in November in Verona, Italy. This festival began in 1898 as a simple horse market but now hosts FEI World Cup Show jumping, plus championship Western events, such as cutting and team penning, gymkhana competitions, and other equine spectacles.

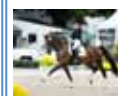


