



Rule changes approved by USEF 1/17/2013

Competitors are responsible for knowing the rules of their sport.

You can find the complete RULE BOOK on the USEF web site: select the Rules and Regulations menu, then select Rule Book on the sub menu. Web link: *www.usef.org/_IFrames/RuleBook/rulebooks.aspx*

For newly approved RULE CHANGES select the Rules and Regulations menu, then select Rule Change on the sub menu. Then under Completed Rule Changes, select 2013 Competition year. Web link: *www.usef.org/_IFrames/ RuleBook/ChangesSearch.aspx*

Some important highlights for competitors and management are listed below but everyone involved in the sport is encouraged to obtain a USEF Rule book and learn the rules governing your discipline. Rule books are available in hard copy or in downloadable formats for PC / MAC or Flash Drives.

- 1. Clarifications on movements including the halt, the walk on long rein, the rein back, the correct place for changing the diagonal in the rising trot, and lateral work. These clarifications can affect your score.
- 2. Clarifications on the judging and scoring of tests
- 3. Dress (DR 120) has several modifications. PLEASE READ THE FULL DRESS /SADDLERY RULES
 - Riders in Level 1 competitions and opportunity class in Level 2 and Level 3 competitions are allowed to wear any color of breeches and shirt as specified in DR 120, Jackets and vests of any type are allowed but not required, the rider may wear neckwear if they are wearing a jacket, however, boots and protective headgear are required. See DR 126.2 for a description of the different levels of Dressage Competitions.
- 4. Expanded protective headgear ruling:
 - From the time horses are officially admitted to the competition grounds by competition management, anyone mounted on a horse at any time on the competition grounds including non-competing riders, riders on non-competing horses, and those competing in all classes and tests, including Para-Equestrian tests must wear protective headgear as defined by this rule and otherwise in compliance with GR801. Any rider violating this rule at any time must immediately be prohibited from further riding until such headgear is properly in place. Protective headgear is defined as a riding helmet which meets or exceeds ASTM (American Society for Testing and Materials)/SEI(Safety Equipment Institute) standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. The harness must be secured and properly fitted.
- 5. FEI rules apply to CDI classes: Top hats and bowlers are allowed in CDI dressage classes, and in the warmup immediately preceding the class and going back to the stable after the class, at all other times, riders are required to wear protective headgear.
- 6. Fly Hoods: Now allowed in outdoor competitions. They must be discreet in design and must be removed by the rider or representative for inspection by the ring steward during the routine bit and saddlery check following the test.

This is only a partial list of the rule changes. You should review the rules in the rule book annually and specifically familiarize yourself with the rule changes before the competition season starts. Best of Luck to all our ESDCTA Dressage riders! Have a great competition year!

Things To Do Before Starting Your Eventing Season

We've had a few warm days. The sun shines longer. You're anxious to go out and have fun at a horse trials. Whoa, partner! There are some things you should do first.

1. Consider your horse's fitness. Maybe you don't have an indoor, so you haven't been riding much, or maybe you have had an indoor and you've been getting on. But, have you really been working or has it been a case of an hour comprised of walk a bit, stop and chat, lazily trot, chat some more and so on? I hate to say it but that life of leisure has not prepared your horse for properly executing the three phases of an event.

2. Consider your horse's mental fitness. He's probably been seeing the same sights for months now. Have his travels been limited from stall to ring or stall to turnout paddock only? Chances are that with frozen footing followed by mud bogs, your horse has chosen self-preservation and has done little more than stand around. Start refreshing his mind by getting him out as much as possible. This may be as simple as walking on the driveways around your farm after you ride. If traffic and surfaces permit, consider a road hack. If possible, see if you can ship over to another farm to use their rings.

3. Evaluate your own fitness. So you're really good at sitting the trot now. You can keep that backside of yours securely planted in that cozy dressage saddle, but can you get it out and keep it there? Your horse won't be happy during the jumping phases if you collapse on his back. Practice your two-point position. Pull out your jump saddle and ride in it. Play with your stirrup length. Spend some time riding with them at a shortened length. Your legs will appreciate that the first jump school you go to.

4. Pull out the rest of your tack that has been sitting, and examine it closely for any signs of wear or weakness. Put it on your horse and evaluate the fit. Does it really suit her well? Contact a qualified fitter if you have any doubt about the saddle. Reflocking is relatively inexpensive and can make a significant difference in your horse's happiness and performance. Make sure your girth is the right size. It shouldn't be so big that it can buckle into the top billet hole on both sides. Nor should it be so small that you get hand cramps trying to make it to the first hole. Look at the bridle and make sure it avoids generating uncomfortable pressure points. Discuss your bit choice with your trainer. She may recommend a change as you enter the new season.

5. Check your show clothes. Are they ready to go? Has your build changed over the winter? You don't want to go to an event to find that you can't get your boot over your calf or button your jacket. If your jacket hasn't been to the dry cleaner since the last show, get it there ASAP. No one wants last year's odors coming to life this year!

6. Consult your farrier. Let him know what your plans are and have him watch your horse move. Consider having him put stud holes in your next set of shoes and discuss the role of studs with

your trainer. Remember to use stud hole plugs or you may find that the hole has been stripped when you try to insert a stud at an event. Get in the habit of keeping the shoes just removed from your horse until you replace them after the next shoeing. Bring them with you to your events. The time between phases is limited and the show farrier may not have enough time to customize a replacement shoe if you lose one. You may be able to continue if you have a shoe that can serve as a quick fix.

7. Get a checkup for your trailer. Annual maintenance is important for safety and for extending the life of the trailer. Don't assume that everything is fine just because you had it serviced at the end of last season. How do you know that a mouse didn't snack on your wiring, or that your tires didn't go soft over the winter unless you check?

Did you skip the last paragraph since you hitch rides with a friend? If so, this one's for you. You may think you're being very generous by paying for the gas burned on your road trips. Your driver, probably your friend, is likely bearing a bigger burden than you realize. There are many costs associated with trailering and your gas money doesn't cover them. Responsibilities of trailer ownership are not just financial and you can help out here. Want to be a friend? Offer to help her give the trailer a good spring cleaning. Buy some goodies for it. A broom with effective bristles, a stocked grooming tote, or a hanging organizer are thoughtful, yet inexpensive, ideas. You can bring an extra smile to her face by customizing the items in her colors by using duck tape or spray paint.

8. Really read your omnibus (don't just skim it), including the rules and requirements. Select events and divisions that are good choices for you and your horse. Don't go somewhere just because it's close and don't select a level just because it will probably be run at a desirable time of the day. If your horse has only been working on flat terrain, don't select an event that is run over hills. Ask other competitors for their experiences at particular events. You may also reach out to organizers if you have questions. Pencil your selections on the family calendar. Avoid using ink because there's a good chance your plans will change over the season. Use the family calendar so that domestic conflicts over scheduling are minimized. Use permanent marker for blocking off October 5th and 6th – those are the dates of the ESDCTA Horse Trials at the Horse Park of New Jersey, and your participation is strongly encouraged!

While you have your omnibus out, look for opportunities to volunteer. Volunteering is a great way to learn, and hours are needed for year-end awards. It also provides a chance to meet new friends. Additionally, by volunteering you are instrumental in providing for the continued existence of the activities in which you wish to participate. Events can't run without volunteers, and ESDCTA needs you.

With a little advance planning, you can increase your chances of having a successful and funfilled season. Whether you earn the blue or no ribbon at all, you can have a great time trying.



Whether it is seeing her at shows riding and coaching, or hearing her name being announced for year end awards or at competitions, many people probably are familiar with Erin's name. She rides, trains, and is the full-time manager at Suddenly Farm in Lumberton, NJ. Her parents have owned Suddenly Farm for over thirty years and her grandparents had before that. Erin grew up with horses in her life and has been riding for as long as she can remember. Throughout her riding career, she has done a little bit of everything. As a kid, Erin did local hunter shows, 4-H shows, and was a member of Pony Club. It wasn't until high school that she got into dressage when she wanted to try something different.

At the time, Erin was riding a TB mare, who was the last TB born on the farm when her grandparents had Suddenly as a TB racing farm. The mare wasn't quite as thrilled about trying dressage and so the pair ended up eventing some. Even while eventing, Erin really enjoyed the dressage and flat work best.

In 2002, Erin began training with Jane Landau of West Windsor, NJ and began taking clinics with Leif Sorensen of Denmark. Dressage really stood out for Erin, as there is always something to learn and you learn something new almost every day, whether that be for you or your horse.

Erin also teaches lessons and learns from teaching and watching her students' progress through the levels. Currently, she has around ten students competing from starter level at schooling shows to third level at recognized competitions. They're like a second family and everyone is very supportive of each other; in fact they all feel each other's accomplishments and have fun seeing each other's hard work pay off!

Currently, Erin has two main horses, both Danish Warmbloods. Erin has had Lennox for nine years and he is her main focus for the 2013 season. She hopes for them to have a successful year at Fourth Level this year and to try PSG before 2013 is over! Erin also has Ashiroh, her 20-year-old schoolmaster. Together, the pair has competed Grand Prix for three seasons and were the 2012 ESDCTA Champion at Grand Prix for ESDCTA Year End Awards. With both horses, Erin has competed at numerous GAIG and CBLM Championships and has earned her ESDCTA and USDF bronze, silver, and gold medals!
