STUART HORSE TRIALS – GO TEAM ESDCTA!!!!

For July 12 through July 15, the ESDCTA Youth Eventing Team went to Victor, NY, to compete at the Cosequin Stuart Horse Trails (SHT). The six team members traveled from various locations, with some members having a four-and-a-half-hour trip while others had a ten-hour trip! But, the camaraderie began early when team member, Christy Pellegrino, was stuck in unmoving traffic for hours on Route 80. Christy had left early for SHT, and being considerate of her teammates, immediately called us to tell us about the traffic jam so we could plan alternative routes and not have to suffer what she did.

When all of us finally arrived everyone got to work. Together we unloaded all of the trailers, organized tack rooms, and settled all of the horses comfortably into their stalls. Once the tasks were completed, the team coach, Marcia Kulak, arrived with her horses. Just as quickly and efficiently, the team settled her into the barn and then we all went for a XC course walk. The rolling hills and well-built fences made for an amazing and technical course. SHT was defiantly not a place to come unprepared; if you were running novice, you got a real novice course. At the beginning and at the end of our course walk Coach Kulak had a brief talk with all of us about how imperative it was that we worked as a team during the event, especially for XC. She was right, the following day we had the dressage and XC rides, and the ride times were spread out. Because the first ride was at 8am and the final ride was at 3:45pm, everyone had to pitch in. "The support from the whole team was tremendous; everyone did their part" said our Chef d'equipe, my Mom, Tricia Lutfy, who warmed everyone up for the dressage phase way down at Ring 3, which was a 15-minute walk from our stabling.

Later in the XC warm up, things got a bit hectic, it was helpful to reflect on Coach Kulak's words when she calmly told us that in warm up we shouldn't worry about everyone else and to stay focused on what we were doing. I was the first rider that went out of the XC start box and right there with me were my

While we have to be careful of our finances, we also want to make sure that we remain vibrant, not stagnant; that we continue to engage you rather than lose you; and that our ultimate mission of education is on the front burner instead of the back.

Again, I thank you for your involvement and participation in answering the surveys and sending me your comments. The Board of Trustees comprises members just like you, and we want you to know that we are listening.

ESDCTA Statement of Purpose

Eastern States Dressage and Combined Training Association (ESDCTA) was founded in June 1969 and incorporated in 1970 as a nonprofit educational organization under the laws of the State of New Jersey. ESDCTA with membership open to all interested in dressage and combined training, has the following stated purpose: *"Whereas it is the desire among many equestrians in the United States to foster and stimulate interest in dressage and eventing in the hope that this may ultimately benefit the United States Olympic Team in its international competition, this organization is established as a nonprofit educational organization."* Its further purposes are to foster and stimulate interest in dressage and eventing in general, to educate, conduct clinics and hold dressage shows and combined training events.

Congratulations to Nicole DelGiorno, who was selected for the Young Rider Olympic Dream Program. The Young Rider Olympic Dream Program is funded and administered by the Dressage Foundation. It is in its eleventh year and evolved as a result of former Olympian Michael Poulin's wish to offer an opportunity for gifted Young Riders to enhance their understanding of dressage theory through a European tour. The program is open to USDF Young Riders, who are 16-21 years of age, as well as 22 year-old graduates of the Advanced Young Rider Program, who are riding at Fourth Level or above. This 10-day experience is set for August 12-22, with visits to Ingrid Klimke, Jean Bemelmans, Wolfram Wittig, Mathias Rath, Hubertus Schmidt and Klaus Balkenhol, along with a trip to the CDI in Cappein, Germany.

Nicole DelGiorno, age 20, is a USDF bronze and silver medalist and seasoned FEI Jr/YR competitor, having qualified and competed several years at the NAJYRC and the USEF Festival of Champions with multiple horses, the most notable being Lamborghini Dane, owned by Kathleen Faltz. She helped to bring home the junior team bronze in 2007 and 2009, and was the 2X junior gold medalist at the 2009 NAJYRC. As a YR, Nicole qualified and attended the NAJYRC and had top placings at the USEF National Championships in both 2010 and 2011. Dedicated to promoting youth in dressage, Nicole served 2 years as Chair of the USDF Youth Executive Committee and 4 years as Region 1's USDF Youth Representative. In 2009, Nicole was presented with the prestigious Region 1



Outstanding Performance at the National Level Award and in 2011, the Outstanding Youth Contribution to the Dressage Community Award. Nicole has been involved with Lendon's Youth Dressage Festival for 9 years, 3 as a competitor and 6 as a volunteer. She is an active B dressage certified member of the Shore Riders Pony Club in the Delmarva Region and has served on the USPC Youth Board for 2 years. Nicole will be entering her junior year at the University of Richmond, majoring in International Business and Leadership Studies, and will be spending the fall semester studying abroad in Madrid. She plans to continue with her training while in Spain, and is excited about the opportunity to work with PREs and to gain a deeper knowledge of the Spanish breed. Nicole continues to volunteer, train horses, and teach students in her spare time and is an avid reader, writer, and photographer.

Another Great Lendon Gray's Youth Dressage Festival

Camaraderie, fun, learning, and success were all hallmarks of this year's ESDCTA teams at the Lendon Grey Youth Dressage Festival (LGYDF) held July 6-8, in Saugerties NY, at the HITS on the Hudson show grounds. Fifty-nine teams of 3 or 4 riders each and 293 individuals competed.

The ESDCTA sponsored 6 riders, forming 2 teams of 3 riders each, headed by Chef d' Equipe, Cindy Roesener. The young equestrians competed in a 3-phase competition: 1) a written exam focusing on dressage training, equine health and stable management; 2) a USDF dressage test (which is at the level the horse/rider combination is currently competing); and 3) a dressage seat equitation class. The scores from each phase were added together to give each rider their final score. In the team competition the scores from each of the riders on the team were added together to provide a team score. There were also "fun" classes on Sunday, which individuals could compete in, as well as competitions for best decorated tackroom and golf cart, just to name a few.... Our teams' theme this year was the Olympics, and were aptly named the Olympians and the Medalists.

As teams and individuals, our ESDCTA riders represented the organization well. ESDCTA team Olympians placed first in their section and finished 6th overall – our highest placement ever! Our team Medalists finished with a solid score, but did not place. As individuals, we had riders earn ribbons in their divisions and place well in each of the classes they competed in.

The Olympians:

- **Madeline Griffith** – Division First Level age 16-17: Written test 1st place (100%); Dressage Test (67.1%); Equitation (89%); Overall Division 3rd place. Dressage Trail W/T/C age 17-21 (76.42%).
- **Kylie Dickinson** – Written test 6th place (88%); Dressage test 1st place (74%); Equitation 5th place (89%); 3rd overall in her division.
- **Erika Olisjlager** – Written test- 1st place (98%); Dressage test (66.4%); Equitation (88%); 6th place overall in her division.

The Medalists:

- **Amanda McAuliffe** – Written test (84%); Dressage test 4th place (63.8%); Equitation 6th place (80%); 7th overall in her division. Prix Caprilli (67%); Dressage Trail (74%).
- **Amanda Perkowski** – Written test 1st place (96%); Equitation 2nd place (94%); Dressage test (61%); 2nd place overall in her division.
- **Christy Pellegrino** – Equitation 5th place

As a trainer, I was impressed with the level of care team members provided their horses. All of the horses were well turned out and kept happy and healthy by their riders' and their families' conscientious care during the 3 days in which we saw temperatures in excess of 90 degrees. In addition, team members exhibited great sportsmanship by not only helping each other in the stable, but going out to cheer on and support each other while competing. Special thanks to Wendy Garfinkel, trainer of two of the team riders, for the help and support she provided to the ESDCTA teams.

Thank you so much for sponsoring me to go to Lendon's Youth Dressage Festival (LYDF) as part of the ESDCTA Dressage Team. This was my very first experience at the LYDF, and I enjoyed every minute of it! My team was called the ESDCTA Medalists in honor of the upcoming Olympics. teammates, Alyssa and Jessica Ruffa, our Chef, and Coach Kulak, all encouraging me on. The rest of my teammates were out watching on the course and once again they were all there waiting at the finish line to help me.

After each of us finished the XC phase, there was someone stripping the horse's tack and someone else making sure the rider had cold water (it was extremely hot). As a group we all walked together to the wash station, which we called the "wash tunnel." Once at the wash tunnel everyone grabbed a sponge and helped cool down the horse. We had brought my cousins, James Failla and Ryan Gardiner, sisters of riders, Isabella Ruffa and Erika Olijslager, and our parents as our ground people. They were important members of the team that made this system work beautifully!

"It felt so good to cross the finish line and have your whole team standing there waiting to help you and cheering you on," said competitor Sofie Lutfy.

Dressage and XC day was a huge success for everyone, but our day was not done. We all worked together to secure the horses and the tack room for the night and then continued on to the stadium course walk. Coach Kulak walked with us to give us insight into the course design. We each had to repeat a stage of the course to her and were encouraged to remember the difference between walking strides and walking feet. Coach Kulak drove home the point of understanding the importance of having a balanced horse, especially in this narrow course with grass footing. We were always asked if we had any questions and went over our own rides with each other to help the next rider to avoid those problems or questions we encountered.

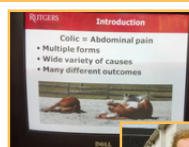
Waking up early the following morning, we arrived at the show and got ready for stadium. Because we arrived early we were able to support some of our friends riding in other divisions. The whole team was braiding, getting dressed, and discussing the course with each other. The first rider of the day was Jorgen. He had a clear round and won a fifth place prize on June Brody's horse, Classic, in the Open Novice division. Christy Pellegrino then went on her horse, Christmas Eve; even with a rail down, Christy expressed great horsemanship by thanking her horse for a great stadium round. Then Alyssa Ruffa rode, with one rail down, and I had a good round on my horse, Flip; we had two rails, but I thanked my horse for his super efforts and knew what we needed to work on for a clear round next time. Both Sofie Lutfy and Jessica Ruffa had clear and very exciting rounds. When Sofie cleared her final jump with a pop fly from her pony, Mighty Mouse, everyone started to cheer. Sofie ended up tied for 6th giving her a 7th place ribbon as she was a bit faster than the optimal time XC. Jessica Ruffa was our last to go in our division, as it was reverse order of placing and Jessica was in third place in the very competitive junior division. A field of 15 had only a 6-point spread so it was anyone's round. Jessica's clear round with no penalties kept her in third place for the division and she won \$300 and a gift basket as the first place winner for the newly formed division for OTTB second career racehorses. Jessica said loudly, "I love you Graham," as she ran through the finish flags at the end of her speedy stadium round!

Finally the last ride of the day was Jorgen's Open beginner novice run on his horse, Northern Quest Lady's Man. After a clear round, Jorgen Olijslager won his division with

a 26.2, and also won a prize for being the highest scoring Irish Draught horse in his division. "Stuart's sponsors did a wonderful job in donating very generous prizes to the top finishing horse and rider combinations," said Jorgen after receiving many prizes for his win.

We all learned more about strategy, as well as how to be a good team member with your horse. It is also great to know we have another super ESDCTA member at SHT, Nicole Carolan, and her horse, Top Gun, who took home the top prize, first place in the junior novice division with a 28.5 score for the win!

Although everyone was more than a bit tired, we all managed to use the last of our energy to help each other load everything into the trailers. On the ride home, it really hit me that our teamwork was amazing and that without it, the weekend would have been half the fun and most likely not as successful. SHT was like no other event. We went into the competition as individuals, but we really were a team. Someone was always there to hand you a bottle of water or give you a hug if you had a bad ride. We is definitely greater than I.



FEEDING HORSES AFTER COLIC WEBINAR HITS HOME

What are we feeding our horses?
Is their home a colic-preventing environment?

The ESDCTA webinar presented by Dr. Sarah Ralston, VMD, PhD, DACVN, of Rutgers University's Equine Science Center July 10, answered these questions, with the take-home message being: to prevent colic, reduce grain and increase fiber.

Ralston said many people believe that the hay has to be excellent quality. She said the most important factor to helping a horse with intestinal motility is the chewing. She said even when your horses are out on grass, access to hay is essential to maintaining their health. But, feeding nontraditional hay, such as round bales, can lead to problems.

Ralston said a horse should eat 2% of its body weight in forage daily.

Access to water is very important and keeping water warm in winter for continued access and sufficient supply year-round are critical. Be mindful of whether the troughs in pastures are sufficient for the number of horses lining up to drink.

When feeding grains, Ralston said to make sure the feed is high in fiber – 12% or higher – and high in fat – 5-10%.

Going to a show? Moving? Bring your own hay to avoid sudden changes. Ralston said she gets her horses accustomed to flavored water in case she has to move them and they will not drink from a water source that tastes strange. She said she can then flavor that water to make it more familiar and palatable to the horse.

Cross-Country Schooling Day: You've Marked it on Your Calendar, Now What?

Private farms, show facilities, and horse parks occasionally offer cross-country schooling opportunities. These days can be great for building confidence and are also lots of fun, but to make the most of them, you should have a plan. Be sure to read the offering fully. Look for details such as hours, level of jumps offered, and conditions of participation. Some organizers require that each rider or specified maximum number of riders have an unmounted ground person, and this person may need to be of a minimum age. Other venues may allow a mounted partner. You most likely will be required to present a Coggins, current within a certain time period. Being a member of an organization may get you a reduced rate, so be ready to offer some proof of membership.

What to bring is an important question to answer. Start with your trainer, if he or she is available; don't despair if not. Most riders with a moderate amount of experience and a sensible horse can enjoy their outing, even without their pro present. The more the merrier (usually), so network ahead of time. You may find that many of your acquaintances will want to go with you if they knew a familiar face would also be there. Consider planning for a tailgate afterwards! Even if you don't tailgate, be sure to bring refreshments, especially fluids, for you, in addition to your horse. You may be surprised how quickly you can dehydrate in hot, or even warm, weather. You may be out for a while, so have a blood-sugar restoring snack on hand. Safety first, so dress yourself in appropriate protective apparel. This includes legitimate riding boots, a secure, approved, and well fitting helmet, as well as a protective vest. A medical armband (as is required whenever jumping in a USEA event) may be a good piece of insurance.

Perhaps most importantly, bring the right horse. If you've never tried him outside of a ring, try a hack around your farm before exposing him to the electric atmosphere of a cross-country course. Plan carefully for what you will need for your horse. The bit that may work so wonderfully in the dressage ring may prove quite ineffective out in the open. But also, don't experiment with something so severe that your horse slides to a halt with the slightest rein pressure. Know what works for him. Avoid fleece-lined boots if you plan on doing any water complexes. Because you can't be sure that you will be able to avoid all water, go with a neoprene or similar boot, and avoid polo wraps as they can unravel and become dangerous. Bring plenty of drinking and washing water for him. He'll appreciate some TLC after all of his good work.

Have a flexible plan and goals for once you are out on course. For example, you may be determined to do a Trakehner, but if they don't have one for your level, look for a hanging log instead. Start with a good warm-up. Cross-country riding is not a reckless run, but on the flip side, the canter that is so cute in your dressage test may be too understated for the jump phase at your level of eventing. The horse should be fluid and forward in his movement, so make sure he has the opportunity to move at a pace appropriate to his level. Select the right jumps for you. Start with lower, easy fences to get your and your horse's confidence up. Often, cross-country days are offered after a horse trials has been held. The course may still be flagged, so be sure you know what the markers mean. Jump only in the direction in which the obstacles are flagged. Keep the red flag on your right. Understand the colors. A fence with a white number on a black background (Training) is harder than one with a black number on a white background (Novice). A fence may at first appear to be suitable for your level even though it is flagged for a higher one, but carefully consider why before attempting to jump it. Perhaps the challenge lies in its placement. The trick may be that it was flagged as part of a combination. As a single entity, it might be fine for you. In combination with its flagged partner, it may be too much. Ride around your fences before jumping them. If you don't, you may be backed off more than you realize and ride with hesitation that you transmit to your horse. You don't have to let him stop and smell everything, but you should have a good idea about what you are dealing with.

There are also unwritten courtesies that should be followed. Before galloping to a fence, see if someone else has been waiting for their turn. If you are not sure if they are waiting, ask. Similarly, don't hog a fence. It may be tempting to try one fence over and over again until you get it just perfect, but don't. That's hard on your horse and may be counterproductive. It's also rude to those who are waiting. Know when it's time to call it a day. You don't have to jump all of the jumps or wear out your horse. Make good choices so that you and your mount are all smiles as you drive home.

HORSE TREATS

With the release of *War Horse* (both the play and the movie) last year, you may be wondering about the history of horses in battle, and how it evolved into sport. While there is no straight line from warhorse to pleasure mount, below are some milestones in the transition from an instrument of war to our partners in sport.

The earliest evidence of horses being ridden in war is from Eurasia and dates from between 4000 and 3000 BC. Chariot warfare was seen as early as 2500 BC in Samaria, and a training manual from 1350 BC for training chariot horses for war was discovered in the Ancient Near East. Xenophon, the famous Greek cavalry officer wrote his treatise on

horsemanship in 360 BC, and is the basis of modern day dressage.

World War I marked the most significant change in the use of horses in war. In the early years, cavalry battles were common, but with the introduction of trench warfare, barbed wire, and machine guns, not to mention tanks, the horse became almost obsolete other than as a pack animal. During World War II, several nations continued to use horses. The last British cavalry charge was on March 21, 1942, and the only American cavalry unit was the 26th Cavalry, based in the Philippines, who charged the Japanese in the town of Morong on January 16, 1942.

- Dressage Seat Equitation: Automatic through your one qualifying score or by riding in a DSE class and obtaining a minimum score of 68%

Tests that will be ridden at the Championship Show:

- Starter - W/T: USDF-A and USDF-B and Starter W/T/C: USDF-C and Training - 1
- Training through Fourth Levels: Tests 2 and 3 of the level
- The two scores will be averaged to achieve a final score that will determine placing
- FEI / MFS / DSE: One ride at the qualifying level

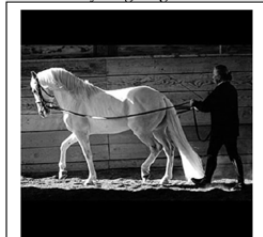

ESDCTA HOLDS PUBLIC MEETING ON "GOING GREEN"

The ESDCTA Board of Trustees gave members the opportunity to say in person whether they wanted the club to "go green" and save money by publishing the newsletter and the omnibus, or part of it, on-line.

On Monday, July 9, the board showed the results of the surveys sent to members and show organizers. While not well attended by members, about six board members were on hand to answer any questions and hear first-hand what members want.

The results of the survey to members clearly were in favor of keeping both the newsletter and the omnibus in hard copy and mailed to members. Out of the six questions asking for preference, the largest share (46%) of respondents said they strongly prefer receiving the hard copy newsletter with an additional 17% saying they somewhat prefer the hard copy. About 65% said they never read it on-line and 85% said they read their mailed copy every month. The respondents, who, in some degree, preferred receiving the newsletter on-line or through email totaled 37%.

Of the four questions asking preference for how the Omnibus is received, 74% said they strongly prefer the hard copy, with an additional 5% saying they somewhat prefer the hard copy.

The surveys allowed members to write in their opinions. Many of the respondents said they keep both the newsletter and Omnibus on hand for continued review, as well as keeping them handy in their barns for others to access.

Half of the show organizers said they believed that the competitors at their shows would prefer the hard copy and online equally, with almost all of the others in favor of the hard copy version. While the majority of the organizers (67%) believe that an abridged hard copy of the Omnibus with details on the web site would work "very much" or "somewhat" for their competitors, 33% said it would not work at all.

Some respondents did believe that that saving money by going green was important to the club, but both publications, however published, were deemed important benefits of membership. Other comments were very useful in regard to content of the publications going forward.

To address the cost of the Omnibus while following the will of the members, the board has decided to put the publication out for bid. This was successfully done last year with the newsletter, resulting in savings for the club. The board is hoping to keep costs down while still bringing a quality publication to its members.

The Board of Trustees wishes to thank everyone for their input and their participation in making such a decision.


