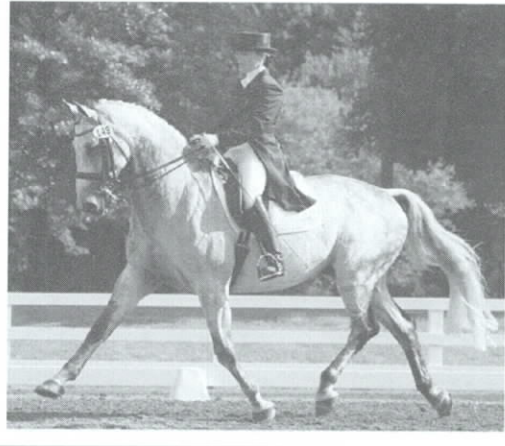

This year the team participants were from two local GMO's: the LVDA and ESDCTA. The weather was gorgeous as horse trailers began to arrive, horses were unloaded, and then saddled by the eager competitors. A group of supporters set up tents, put out refreshments, and displayed their team banners. Chef d'Equipe, Kathy Mastragostino, headed over to the secretary booth to pick up the entry packets for ESDCTA competitors. Our training level team consisted of Tracey Wilson, Melissa Morehouse, Joan Harper, and Brandi Williams. The Mixed Division 1 team included Kathy Thiessen, Marsha Montgomery, and Judie DeWitt. In Division 3, Lauren Chumley and Melissa Pribic, who are ESDCTA members, rode as a Barn Team, XHaltSalute. LVDA had a full contingent at each level including training and several mixed teams.



Kathy and I were busy following our team members between rings. We tried to see each performance. Kathy was always on hand with encouraging words for the riders both before and as they came out of the ring. She held jackets, handed out water, and kept everyone focused on the tests ahead. It was a bustle of activity from one ring to the next. I could not click my camera fast enough to capture it all! It was especially nice to see all of the smiles when rider and horse exited the ring. Everyone appeared to be proud of their horses' performances. The tests were well ridden with attention to placement of transitions and proper self-carriage. For the most part the horses were well behaved except for the occasional buck or spook. Our team seemed pleased with their rides and many later remarked that their score was a personal best. Spirits were high all over the Horse Park as riders took breaks and enjoyed snacks while the horses were grazed. Since I was not riding I enjoyed the famous margaritas being served at the ESDCTA tent. Finally, the long awaited awards ceremony was announced. One by one the riders got dressed back into their show attire and headed to the ring with their equine partners.

At the awards ceremony, beautiful neck sashes were placed over the heads of the horses, and each competitor got a USDF Medallion. It was evident that all of the participants were delighted with their awards and their achievements. The LVDA Training Level Team took first place, gaining a cumulative score of 64.931%, with ESDCTA close behind at 63.745%. Division 2 rides put the LVDA Mixed Teams first and second with scores of 66.474% and 64.586%, respectively. ESDCTA came in third with an average score of 61.76%. Division 3 was won by the XHaltSalute Team, with a score of 68.037%, followed by LVDA at 65.438%, and third and fourth places went to LVDA with scores of 63.957 and 55.376%, respectively. ## OFF TO CAMP!

My friend, Jane Kiceniuk, invited me and my horse, PJ, to go with her and her horse, Lilly, to camp, specifically, the Orange Country Dressage Association (OCDA) Adult Dressage Camp at Victoria Farms in Middletown, NY, on September 24, 2011. I was a little unsure because it was a long way away (2.5 hours), it was relatively expensive, and it would be a long day for my 6-year-old horse, who didn't have a lot of stamina. In the end, I was very glad we agreed to go.

At the farm, we were greeted by a group of very friendly people, who showed us to our stalls and gave us breakfast. There were four clinicians: Corey DeMala, Susan Stegmeyer, Jake Stapel, and Joyce Stever. We each got one private lesson in the morning and then another after lunch, with two lessons going on at once at each end of the indoor arena.

Jane and I had our first lesson at 11am. She rode with Corey and I rode with Susan. Susan told me she pulled her teaching philosophy from a variety of sources, from the classics like Museler, to modern-day Olympians. She stressed keeping a horse in shoulder-fore, but recognized that horses are different from one direction to the other due to their stiff and hollow sides. Thus, despite what the books say about how it should be done, keeping the horse in shoulder fore may involve a different use of the aids in each direction. It was definitely true in PJ's case. His hollow side is the right and in going to the right, I had to think counter-bend to keep his from falling out of the circle. I've been having issues with my canter depart, so we worked on that next. The first thing Susan noticed was that I sat too far back onto the cantle. She thought that that might be the root of my problems, so she adjusted my position to be closer to the pommel and more over PJ's center of balance. She doesn't use the outside leg to ask for the canter because she thinks it pushes the horse's haunches in and puts him off balance. Instead, she had me push PJ out with my inside leg and when I felt that step into the outside rein, then ask with a sweep of my pelvis for the canter. We did this from the walk, and to my surprise, it worked! I don't know how Jane's lesson with Corey went because I was too busy concentrating on my own work, but she seemed to have enjoyed it.

In between our lessons, the OCDA provided a nice lunch and we got to meet some of our fellow campmates. They were mainly OCDA members who were more local. A few of them are ESDCTA members who come down to our area for shows during the year and rode in the ESDCTA Championship Show in September. In the afternoon Jane and I both rode with Joyce. Jane went first and I got to watch.

Jane's mare has a tendency to rush, and most of the lesson was about how to push her just enough to get more out of the gait without getting her tense, a common problem. Joyce said that the horse should not change speed no matter if you are going around in circles, down straightaways, or changing direction, but that it is our job as the rider to regulate the horse, and not the other way around. The bottom line of the lesson was that you have to meet your horse halfway instead of asking for perfection every time, so that the horse can figure out what is expected. As the horse figures it out, the gap between what the horse is doing and what you want the horse to do will diminish, and eventually you both will be on the same page.

For my second lesson my horse was exhausted and not his usual, agreeable self. It was the first time he was ever disobedient during the 1.5 years I've had him. Being the timid rider that I am I jerked on the inside rein when he wouldn't turn and was afraid to kick him forward when he slowed down to look at something, even though I new better. Our original plan to work him through it wasn't working, so Joyce decided to change tactics. She told me to ignore him when he threw his head and concentrate on his engine – his hind end. The goal was now to have him go around the ring in a long and low frame to stretch out his back, but he wasn't allowed to slow down. At first, he was still resistant but when he realized I wasn't going to fight him and I wasn't going to ask him anything that was difficult for him, he relaxed and became the quiet and accepting horse I knew and loved. We ended on that. Similar to what Susan had said, Joyce recognized that we always need to adjust our plans to what our horses need at the moment.

All-and-all, both Jane and I had a great time, met some wonderful people, and gained a lot of riding knowledge. We couldn't wait to get home and practice all of what we learned, but it would have to wait because our horses deserved (and definitely needed) a couple of

## Salute

Cindy Roesener was born with a love of horses in her blood. Some of Cindy's earliest memories are going to ride after church on Sunday mornings as a child. She started taking lessons as a young girl, and wanted to spend every day and night with horses. After many years of begging for a pony of her own, Cindy finally got a little pinto pony named Jane. She spent every moment that she could at the barn pampering Jane, doing chores, and just enjoying having a pony of her own. When it came time to go to college Cindy knew that she wanted to major in equine science. She had been working part time at horse farms for years and knew that was what she wanted to do with her life. After looking around at schools she decided to attend Centenary College in Hackettstown, NJ .

Cindy had a great time in college learning about the horse industry and improving her riding skills. She even earned a spot on the IHSA team while at college. Her solid seat and love of jumping made for a successful IHSA career, even earning a Championship at Regionals and placing at Zones. It was during college that Cindy discovered dressage. She decided to take a dressage class in addition to her hunt seat classes to expand her knowledge base. Once she started riding dressage she fell in love with the challenge of it and wanted to learn more.

Once she graduated, Cindy started working in the equine industry fulltime. She held a working student position with Heather Mason at Flying Change Farm, learning all she could about dressage and improving her riding while at the same time working at multiple barns as a manager and doing direct horse care. Cindy carried on learning and working for years, along the way earning her USDF Bronze and Silver Medals and becoming an L Judge. Eventually, working 14-hour days, 7 days a week, and taking care of 4 farms and a training business became overwhelming. Instead of giving up her career, Cindy just reassessed her goals and found a larger farm that was a better fit what she wanted to be doing.

Cindy is currently the farm manager for the Beaver Creek Equestrian Center in Ringoes, NJ. She also runs a successful training business, CLR Stables. While she loves dressage, Cindy also still enjoys jumping and competes in hunter and jumper competitions when she can. It is not uncommon to see her at a dressage show on a Saturday riding a Third level test and that same weekend to be at a hunter show on Sunday riding a 3-foot course.

Her versatility is something that she tries to pass off to her clients. She feels that good riding is good riding no matter what the discipline, and Cindy has a client list full of good riders. From her adult amateurs doing well at the local shows to her young clients earning top ribbons at the Lendon's Youth Dressage Festival, Cindy has shown her clients through example that a love of horses and a good work ethic will help you on the path to success. In 2007, she was voted one of the top 50 Riding Instructors in America by the American Riding Instructors Association. She has so much fun with her clients that when she realized that they could all benefit from some cross training she found a Pilates instructor who would be willing to come to the barn every Saturday and give a class. Cindy knows that if you work in the equine industry no two days will ever be the same, but that is what keeps it interesting.

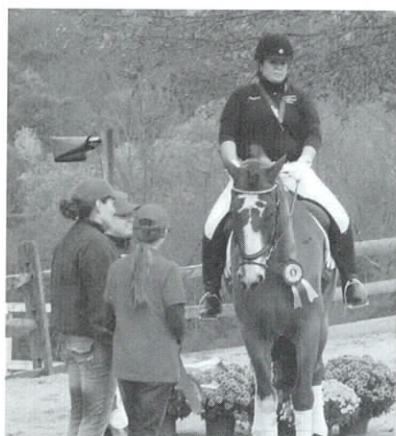
In order to reduce newsletter production costs and go a bit greener than in the past, we have limited the show results in the newsletter to 1st through 4th places.

# HORSE TREATS

It's the holidays, and what's better than baking a nice treat for our horses when the weather turns cold? Here's a treat recipe they are sure to love.

## Ingredients:

1 cup flour

½ cup molasses

½ cup vegetable oil

1 cup sugar

Handful of crushed peppermints

## Directions:

Preheat the oven to 350 degrees. Mix the sugar, flour, and crushed peppermints in a bowl. Add in the molasses and vegetable oil. Stir until well blended, so that the mix is sticky but not runny. If it is too runny, add flour; if it is too thick, add a little more molasses and oil. Drop tablespoon amounts onto a baking sheet and flatten slightly. Bake for 10-15 minutes so that they are crunchy. Let cool. Yum!

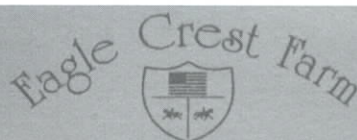
