ESDCTA, in conjunction with Centerline Events was proud to host another successful CDI 3* and Memorial Weekend Dressage Show. Our roster of CDI representatives came from the USA, the Philippines, Canada, Australia, Argentina, Ecuador, Denmark, the Dominican Republic, Korea, and the Netherlands. This year, the total of CDI rides jumped by 50% for a total 95 rides!

The riders, trainers, and grooms celebrated in the pavilion afterward at a special reception. A jubilant atmosphere was evident with many handshakes and good-will wishes exchanged. ESDCTA SUMMER SERIES KICKS OFF

WITH A PSYCHOLOGICAL TWIST

Sports psychologist Scottie King Reeves, PhD, explained our behavior and how to improve it for successful riding at the first installment of ESDCTA and Skyland's Saddlery summer series, "How to Have Fun With Your Horse Again."

About 18 people were on hand at Skylands Saddlery in Ringoes, to hear the seminar entitled "Using Psychology: Improve Your Riding and Create a Better Relationship with Your Horse." Reeves spoke about how to turn around fear, anxiety, nervousness, and a lack of focus into positive skills. She also spoke about setting goals that are achievable rather than those not in the rider's control. "We forget about the impact of the mind, which is enormous on the body," she said.



Reeves said the difference between the top, professional competitors and the rest of us is preparedness. They understand the need to mentally and physically prepare for competition. She said just because they are successful does not mean that they do not have the same anxiety we may have when entering the arena. She said they keep themselves physically fit and use various tools to make sure they are mentally able to meet the challenges and the fears of competition. She said some people visualize, others "talk" through their competition, and others "practice" mentally before the competition, as well as on the horse.

If we think of ourselves as athletes, according to Scotty and Debby, then we need to treat our bodies as such, as well. Great advice. Even devoting just 15 minutes a day to the cause can pay off!

On the "improved" side, we have just had our Memorial Day Weekend Show. I cannot thank enough the Dressage Committee: Chair, Terry Masters, Beth Ann and Keith Adams, Lisa and daughter Lisa Toaldo, and Carol Connor. Keith, Terry tells me, isn't even interested in horses but saves vacation days from his job so that he'll have the time off to attend all of our shows to help us.

And where would be without our fabulous volunteers who man the shows every year? So many people joined together to offer time, effort, and creativity to raise the bar this year. From competitors to vendors, we offered new opportunities, new hospitality events, and new on-site educational programs. It was amazing!

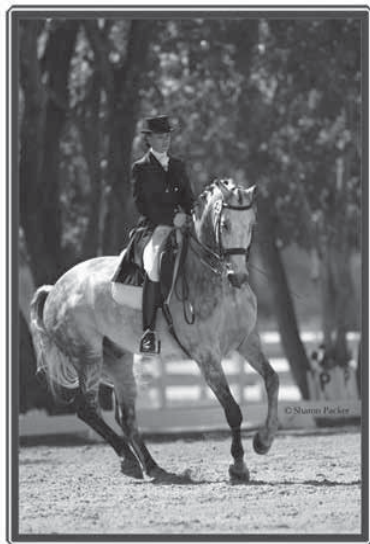

Some of the tools highly successful athletes use that everyone can also benefit from, according to Reeves, are imagery, maintaining concentration and focus, controlling anxiety and activation, positive self-talk, and goal setting. She said it is important not to succumb to the image of seeing yourself doing something negative such as crashing through a fence but to go back and change that image into how the ride will positively go, step by step.

"The brain does not discriminate between what you are actually seeing and what you are conjuring up in your mind," she said, adding, "mental skills take dedicated practice. You want them to become as automatic as your riding skills."

She said focusing on what the task at hand, rather than bringing outside issues to mind, such as something that happened at home or a dog barking alongside the arena, aids concentration. "This is key," she said, "and usually where we all lose it."

Reeves, also an Eventer and trainer, spoke about the need to be an athlete and realize that being physically fit is as important as being mentally fit. Dressage judge Debby Savage echoed this by saying the amateur is still an athlete that must be in condition to meet the demands of successful riding. The Seminar Series will continue through the summer with presentations on the rider's physical fitness, the horse's well-being, and finally, dressage riding exercises that will benefit both horse and rider. Stay tuned for times and dates!

Meanwhile, Rose Sinn was busy checking in the eager competitors arriving for the weekend. It was reported that the USEF/USDF portion of the show had over 427 rides. These dedicated and exceptionally talented competitors aboard well-trained horses came with high hopes of being awarded blue ribbons. A crowd of enthusiastic competitors and friends were seen throughout the show grounds. Every day the bleachers were packed with family and friends cheering on their favorite equestrians. Shoppers were treated to a wide variety of quality items available at the vendors' booths. At the awards table, the camaraderie was obvious as participants congratulated each other on their achievements. Many people remarked on how special they felt being part of the Memorial Weekend event. Others said it was nonstop entertainment, and the special receptions kept people occupied well into the evenings.

Friday evening's festivities began with Dr. Jenny Susser, Sports Psychologist giving her perspective on "How to Prepare Mentally to Perform Your Best Physically". Jenny's sincere and knowledgeable advice for equestrians was well received by the audience. A cheerful (and hungry) crowd proceeded to the Southern Barbecue. Onlookers enjoyed the delicious meal while watching the CDI Grand Prix. A notable group of equestrians went after the title of Champion, with final results giving Ashley Holzer on Pop Art a First Place and Lauren Sammis on Sagacious a Second. We want to thank Kem Barbosa (S) for providing real-time commentary with "Dressage with the Experts" thru headsets during the Grand Prix. It was apparent by the cheers and applause that the Grand Prix was the highlight of Friday's events.

Saturday and Sunday brought the Young Riders into the CDI Ring. These talented riders showed their skills in the CDI Young Rider Individual; Chase Hickok took the honors in this highly contested class with a score of 69.56%. The CDI YR Freestyle honors went to Ashlea Day; it was an awesome experience to see the Australian flag and the anthem played as she received her award. In the afternoon, the CDI Intermediate I took place with 22 rides; a stunning ride by Ashley Holtzer on Ultiemis Flemming gave her the winning score of 72%. The fun continued with an Ice Cream Social sponsored by the ESDCTA Youth committee.

Saturday evening's celebrations also included the Musical Freestyle Reception. Adults relaxed with refreshments while enjoying the lively Grand Prix Freestyle performances. Marilyn Payne (S) was the commentator for this portion of the "Dressage with the Experts". The Ground Jury awarded the GP Freestyle Championship to Ashley Holzer and Pop Art. Sunday, the Intermediate Freestyle had us tapping our feet to the choreographed rides of George Williams, Silke Rambacz, and Cesar Parra on Grandioso who took the honors.

Adult Amateurs comprised a big portion of the riders over the weekend, boasting from 10 to 16 competitors per class. Many amateur contenders took part in the various Adult Amateur Challenge classes. Jane Suwalsky was the proud winner of the FEI Prix St. Georges Adult Amateur Challenge. The complete results of the Memorial Weekend Show are posted on the ESDCTA Web site.

The last Awards Ceremony took place while in the barns, horses and gear were being loaded for the trip home. Many went home victorious while others went home having gained valuable experience. Our ESDCTA staff and devoted volunteers went home satisfied and happy to have done our best to ensure the success of the 2011 Memorial Weekend Dressage competition.

On May 14, six ESDCTA members rode in the first of three ESDCTA Youth Fix-A-Test clinics. This clinic was held at Hidden Creek Equestrian Center in Kunkletown, PA, and all entries benefited the Youth Program. Originally open to only our youth members, two adult amateurs eagerly filled open spots.

Our clinician, Kelly Smaltz (L), graciously donated her time for the clinic, and the use of the venue was donated by Ed and Jill Kuc. Kelly had a lot of insightful tips for each rider after their first test, and every single rider saw an increase in their scores from their first to their second test. Three of our 2011 Youth Team members took part in the clinic, and for some, it was the first clinic they had ever participated in.

Ten-year-old team member, Grace Schierwagen, rode her Thoroughbred gelding, Duncan, in the clinic. A small rider on a 16.2 hand horse, Grace found that Kelly had a lot of great insight into how to best use her body to get better bend out of Duncan. She has since been sharing Kelly's advice with many of her peer riders! Grace will be riding on the youth team for her second year at the Region One Youth Team Competition in Leesburg, VA.

Another youth member, Ashley Coleman, 15, rode her American Warmblood gelding, Thunder. After an accurate but speedy test, Kelly helped Ashley to better control Thunder's energy and they improved multiple percentage points during their second Training Level test. Ashley and Thunder will also be traveling to Virginia this summer with the Youth Team.

Overall, the clinic was a huge success, even with a rainy forecast that every rider willingly braved. Multiple riders and their family members showed up to volunteer, even if they weren't participating themselves. Without our volunteer scribes, scorers, hosts, and of course, our volunteer judge, the clinic could have never happened. Thank you!

ESDCTA Trainers ' Tips, Advice, and Observations

The Dressage Rider as *Athlete*

Recently I attend the ESDCTA program at Skyland Saddlery on Sport Psychology, one of my favorite topics. Dr. Reeves has an impressive background in Eventing, having competed successfully to Intermediate, as well as outstanding academic qualifications. But what struck me as she began her talk was that she constantly referred to the rider as “the athlete,” including herself, and that was the focus and basic premise of her talk.

Immediately what came to my mind was whether many “dressage riders” really consider themselves, and treat themselves, truly as athletes. I am not referring to professionals, as most know what it takes physically to put a horse together. What I am referring to, and we all know what I mean, are those riders who are no way fit enough for their undertaking but seem bent on pursuing it anyway...the riders who are merely passengers, with little appreciation for their own fitness needs. And it seems that often these are the very riders who profess to be seeking that true partnership and special relationship with their horses. It is one thing for a pleasure rider to do what they want in the privacy of their own barn at their leisure, but it becomes quite a different story in a public, competitive setting.

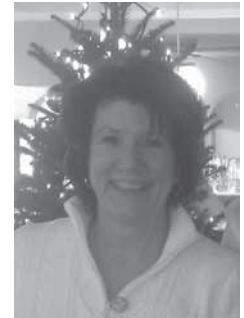
As a judge, I am often dismayed to see obviously unfit riders struggling in the competition arena, with weak seats, relying on their hands (thereby, the horse’s mouth) for balance, and unable to influence their horse, much less exhibit a partnership. I recognize that many just want to have fun, but it doesn’t seem to look like they are having any. Even the USEF rulebook states that “Only the rider who understands how to contract and relax his loin muscles at the right moment is able to influence his horse correctly” (DR117.2—you have to read the rule book, of course!). The FEI rulebook has changed “rider” to “athlete” to emphasize this concept, because it is a *sport, an athletic pursuit*, with the goal of controlling a thousand-pound-plus animal with virtually invisible aids. It requires a heck of a lot of core strength if one really wants to have that elusive partnership with his/her horse. Both members of the “equestrian team” need to be equally fit to do the job at hand.

Perhaps we need to be reminded that the origins of dressage come from war. Xenophon, who wrote the first book on horsemanship, was a Greek warrior. Remember Russell Crowe in *Gladiator* and the gray horse he rode in the Coliseum piaffing away? Modern dressage developed in Europe to test cavalry officers, and still has that heritage a la the Spanish Riding School, the French Cavalry School at Samur, and the German Cavalry School at Hanover, among others. Is it because we do not have that history that it lacks that essence here in America? Is it that, when done right, it looks beautiful and effortless, and thus sucks us in to believing that we too, can create that illusion of beauty on our own horse so easily?

We hear all kinds of excuses: too busy, kids, work, “I just want to have fun” etc, etc. However, it seems that if one is going to spend the time and money in this pursuit of dressage, one would at least be try to maintain some level of athletic physical fitness. Regardless of the type of rider one is, whether professional or amateur, even those who just “do it for fun,” don’t we owe it to our horses to be as fit as we can be for the job?

So let’s follow the lead of Dr. Reeves and the FEI, and give ourselves an extreme mental makeover. Let’s start considering ourselves as athletes rather than just riders, and incorporate this new mentality into our everyday actions. *One should not ride for exercise, one should exercise to ride.* A good general rule of thumb is that one should be fit enough to ride one more horse than one does. Strength training like Pilates or weight training work wonders. Try starting with taking the stairs or walk whenever possible. It doesn’t take much to get down on the floor and do 25 sit ups and 8 push-ups. Even in the car, you can do lower ab contractions or push your shoulders back against the seat. hold it for a 45 count. And then keep it up, because you *can* do it. You can be the athlete you imagine yourself to be and your horse deserves to achieve that partnership you seek through this incredible sport. And ESDCTA, keep up the great work! I look forward to the next program.

She began riding a 4-H backyard horse first Western and then English and was introduced to Eventing in her college years. Then a very special dressage horse came into her life in 1990, a huge Bavarian grand prix horse. It was an incredible challenge to get him on the bit, but once she did, she was hooked. After scribing at several shows and getting the view from C, judging had a special appeal. Debby earned her Silver medal, a critical milestone and judging prerequisite, in 1996, and “r” USEF license in 2000. She received the USDF Region 1 Award for Achievement at the National Level in 2003, and the USDF Gold Medal for Grand Prix in 2008. This past fall, Debby received her USEF “S” license promotion and is also now a member of the International Dressage Officials Club. Her other career is in pharmaceutical marketing, where she has been in advertising and promotional sales for over 23 years--making all this “horsing around” possible, and is graduate of the University of Texas.

Eventing News

After the Fall

A trip to the hospital, usually it's not someone's idea of fun, but if your family is involved with horses or other physical sport, it's nearly inevitable. There are a few practical things that you can do to make the experience much more tolerable. You may want to consider them now.

Let's define a scenario. You've trailered to a schooling horse trials an hour away from home. You're playing groom for your teen-aged daughter who is riding two horses. It's August, it's hot, and it hasn't rained in a week. Dressage went well for "Suzie", and now she's out on the cross-country course. They've just reached that bend coming out of the woods when wham – you see them go down. Trigger's hind end slipped out on the cement-like earth as he made the turn. The horse pops up, but Suzie stays on the ground. You run over and see that Suzie is awake and speaking clearly and sensibly. She complains of pain running down her left leg from her hip. A fracture is not obviously evident, but it's possible. It was a hard hit. The jump judge has Trigger. The show staff has the EMT on the way. Now what?

Being a particularly warm day, you think Suzie's protective gear is likely making her hotter and you may be tempted to start peeling layers off of her, but don't. Wait for the medic's assessment and permission. You can do a few things to try to keep her cool. Ask someone to stand in a position or hold something, so that they make a shadow over her. Fanning her with a program may help. You can allow her to rinse and spit if she's got a mouthful of dirt, but don't offer her water to drink. Her belly should be as empty as possible in the event that she needs surgery to set a broken bone.

Someone, a medic, police officer, or show staff is likely to start asking you a standard set of questions. As long as Suzie is freely moving her arm, you may want to remove her USEA medical armband and hand it to the person asking the questions. It probably has most of the information that the person is looking for.

The ambulance should be there in 15 minutes. Suzie is clearly in pain, but she's pretty well composed. She's chuckling at the little jokes being told to her by the people around who are trying to make her feel better. She knows she's hurt and she asks about Trigger. You may not be worried about him at the moment, but she is. You can make her feel better by using these 15 minutes for more than just staring at her. Ask her if she wants you to go and check on him. If she does, get moving. There's a lot you can do within 15 minutes.

By now, someone probably has Trigger untacked, sponged off, and scrapes scrubbed clean. Hopefully they asked you where your trailer was before they headed off with him. Go back to your trailer as long as you can get there within a few minutes. Let your new found friends continue to help with him. Tell them quickly about any pertinent quirks he might have. Does he freak out if he stands on the trailer without a fly sheet? Will his trailer partner kick out at them when they load him? I like the horses to wear halters with name plates while at shows. It makes things easier if someone needs to know something about one or more of them.

Stop by the dressing room. You know that bag with the shorts and t-shirt Suzie packed for after the show? Grab it now. Throw her sneakers in it, too. Emergency room staff will probably cut most of Suzie's clothes off. Yes, kiss those \$200 breeches good-bye. Of course, if she gets discharged today, they'll give her clothes to go home in. She might not be too happy, however, when they offer her a bright yellow, extra large men's sweatshirt with matching bottoms to go home in.

Go to your car. Grab your cell phone and pocketbook. If you don't have any cash in your wallet, grab the emergency \$10 bill you have stashed in the ashtray. If you don't have a cash stash, ask your friend. Now's not the time to be shy. You will probably be at the hospital for quite a while and most hospital vending machines and cafeterias don't take credit cards. Scoop up a ready snack and drink for yourself if they're handy. Make sure that if you need them, you don't forget your reading glasses. You're going to have forms to complete and waiting room magazines to read. And don't forget your insurance information. Grab Suzie's cell phone and iPod, too. She'll relax more waiting for tests if she can have her creature comforts.

Of course, once you are at the hospital, ask if cell phone use is permitted in all areas. Grab a light jacket if you have one. It's a sweltering day and you're dressed for the weather, but you might want that jacket if you find yourself sitting under a large air conditioning vent.

You should be able to get back to Suzie very quickly. She'll feel better knowing that you've seen her horse and you can honestly say that he's being cared for. She's a teenager and she'll be happy to know that her stuff is going to the hospital with her.

Before you leave the grounds, get a contact number for the show manager or other responsible party who may need to do something with your horses later. You may want to give them your car keys or tell them where you'll put them. They may end up bringing your horses home or to a nearby facility if you can't get back for hours. Keep your house key with you.

Put a call out to your primary care provider. You're an hour away from home, so your doctor probably doesn't have practice privileges at the hospital you will be going to. She can't come to treat Suzie, but she may be able to offer you some advice.

Most of all, don't panic. It will be harder on Suzie if you do. Horse people are a generous lot. Accept the help that is offered and you need. The day isn't good, but you are empowered to make it just a bit better.

P.S. One, more piece of advice. When it's time to plug your trailer lights into the receptacle on your truck, take a good look at the cord. Make sure it's not alive - literally. We went to uncoil the cord one trip last year only to find that it was a big black snake that had coiled itself around the trailer hitch!

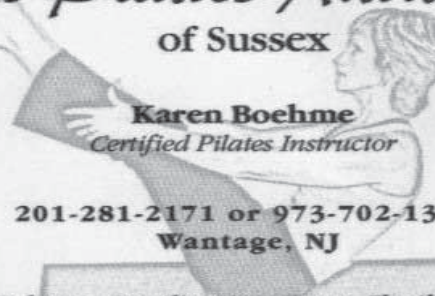
