MEMORIAL WEEKEND DRESSAGE & CDI 3* COMPETITION

Heavy rain clouds accompanied many as they traveled to the New Jersey Horse Park to begin preparations for the MWD/CDI 3* weekend event. Those of us on site Thursday morning were witness to the breathtaking sight of stunning horses schooling while shrouded in a thick mist, as beautiful as a scene from a medieval movie. What an awesome way to begin ESDCTA's most popular and well-attended dressage competition.

The rain continued throughout the three days of competition but did not interfere with the quality of the performances. We were privileged to view local favorites, such as Heather Mason on Warsteiner and Zar, Justin Hardin on Wyatt Star, Lori Shoup on Astaire, and Bonnie Maxon on Wilson in the CDI Prix St Georges held on Friday. Christopher Hickey on Witness Hilltop rode off with the highest score and Heather Mason on Warsteiner proudly accepted second place.

Meanwhile 18 competitors battled it out for ribbons in the Prix St. Georges FEI /USEF level, Ashley Holzer on Rhett and Emily Wyman on Zatino H took top honors. Friday's CDI lineup also included the inspiring rides of the top Young Riders and Junior Riders of Region One. Nicolas Torres Rodriguez on Silver Label took top placement in both the CDI Junior Team and Junior Individual. Following close on Nicolas' heels was Dana Rivera on Abrikos and Eleni Econopouly on Siciliano 2. The CDI YR Team, YR Individual, and YR Freestyle were a clean sweep by the charming Marlee O'Neil. The CDI Grand Prix brought Friday's classes to close with standing ovations for the rides of Ashley Holzer, Cesar Parra, Lauren Sammis, and Heather Mason.

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Last January, one of my boarders, a 33-year-old Arabian, passed away from old age. Serraba had been at my farm for two years, and he had quickly become part of the family and a beloved friend to all the animals and humans who lived at or visited the farm.

"The Senator", as my son liked to call him, was spry and feisty right to the end. While he had some aches and pains, he was still working, taking his owner Vickie out on the trails and continuing the adventures they had had together for 25 years. The two had gone everywhere together, including the beach, and Vickie has a cache of stories that are moving and humorous. When she would come to the barn after work, the dark evening sky was no deterrent to the pair. She would saddle up and don a helmet with a miner's light at the forehead. The two would travel one of my fields, reflecting on the day and finding that peaceful moment when all seems right with the world and no outside influence can mar it in any way.

In the two years that Serraba was at the farm, he saw two new horses come and took it upon himself to teach them the ropes, acclimating them to the culture of the pasture. Zebra was a good representation of a Wimpy-style quarter horse, though his black spots on white background were those of an App. When he entered the boy's pasture for the first time, little Serraba, barely 14.3, quickly came between him and my thoroughbred, Eclipse. He led the two of them around the field for days, making sure everyone was adjusting and no one had thoughts of territorial combat.

Zebra left and Rhapsody, another App, this time more along the lines of an Appendix, tall and well-muscled, came to join the boys. Rhap was completely blind. Both Eclipse and Serraba seemed to understand, and this time they partnered in leading Rhap around and showing him the nooks and crannies of the field. Once Rhap adjusted, Serraba became more independent, knowing that the horse was safe and didn't need side-by-side babysitting anymore.

Serraba also took care of his human friends. For some reason, even non-horsey friends of boarders gravitated to The Senator. Finding no threat from the elderly statesman, it was not unusual for someone to be hanging out with Serraba, grooming him or just finding a pal with which to converse and caress.

On a trail ride during his last summer, Serraba tripped and fell into a narrow ditch. Vickie first thought was to call the state troopers to come and help her extricate him. While waiting, she took his tack off while he lay patiently sensing he needed to be cooperative. She decided to reposition his limbs to get them in a position that he might be able to get his feet underneath him. No panic on Serraba's part, just a wise understanding that Vickie was helping him. When she felt he had a chance, she pulled slightly on his bridle and Serraba made it to his feet. Thankfully, he was fine, not even a scratch. Vickie came back to the barn with her beloved friends to tell yet another tale of how the two of them had partnered to meet yet another challenge.

Jealous of this wonderful partnership, we used to kid Vickie that if she ever left our farm we would kidnap Serraba and hide him so we got to keep him. I miss his lion's whinny in the mornings and his canter toward me when he came in at night. I loved him so that when his vet, Dr. Emily Tomkins of Mid-Atlantic Equine Medical Center, said it was time to say goodbye and Vickie could not bear to do it, I held him while he quietly passed from us.

Serraba was the only horse who ever had the privilege of having his lunch outside, unfettered, and his favorite spot to graze after his grain was the lawn just outside the barn. This is where he lay that night, covered in a sheet that I had made for him so he would leave us in dignity. On it I had written "We love you, Serraba" along with all the names of the people and animals who would miss him. Emily stayed with Serraba and all of us for hours, checking him and rechecking him to assure us all that the time had come. She was so warm and giving to Vickie as well as me and everyone else who stayed to comfort and support Vickie and say their farewells to Serraba. She respected Serraba and she respected his loved ones.

I could not write about Serraba when he first died. I now know that, in addition to remembering him, it is time to honor Emily and all the vets that take care of our wonderful horses and us when these difficult times are upon us. No one can take away the pain, but vets like Emily help us through it and that is a gift. Thank you to all of you who have the humanity and compassion to grant us that gift.

HORSE TREATS

We all think our horses are special. However, there are some horses everyone in the world thinks are special. Below are some world record holders.

Tallest horse: Samson, a Shire gelding who stood 21.2½ hh. He was foaled in 1846 in England. He was renamed Mammouth when he was 4 years old due to his size.

Shortest horse: Little Pumpkin was only 3.2 hh (14 inches tall) and weighted only 20 pounds. He was foaled in April 15, 1973, and lived in South Carolina.

Oldest horse: Old Billy, a Cleveland Bay or draft cross, was foaled in 1760 in England. He lived to be 62 years old, dying in 1822.

Heaviest horse: Brooklyn Supreme, a Belgian born in 1928, was recorded weighing 3200 lbs (1.42 tons).

Longest tail: A Palomino named Chinook had a tail that measured 22 feet.

Longest mane: Maude, a mare from California, had an 18-foot mane.

Most race wins: A horse named Kingston had 89 wins from 138 starts between 1986 and 1994.

Most Olympic gold medals: In show jumping it was a horse named Halla, ridden by Hans-Gunther Winkler, who won 2 gold medals in 1956 (individual and team) and 1 in 1960 (team). In eventing it was a horse named Marcroix, ridden by Charles Pahud de Mortanges, who won 2 golds in 1928 (individual and team) and 1 in 1932 (individual). In dressage it was Rembrandt, ridden by Nicole Uphoff, who won 2 golds (individual and team) in 1988 and again in 1992.

Got Our Butts Kicked and Loved Every Minute of It – A Clinic with Linda Zang

My friend, Betsy, brought this clinic to my attention. We were a little afraid to sign up, as we were only training level riders and this was *the* Linda Zang, but we submitted our entries before we lost our nerve.

The clinic was hosted by Marilyn Payne at Applewood Farm on June 12-13, 2012. Although the weather was frightful, we hoped our rides would not be as we loaded our horses and got on the road. Marilyn welcomed us with coffee and a warm smile. Even though our times were not until the afternoon, we got there just before the first ride, so we could learn from the other participants.

The first thing we noticed was that Linda could assess a horse and rider's issues in about 5 minutes of walking, trotting, and cantering. A common theme of hers was not to get angry at the horse for making a mistake. One horse kept doing a flying change before being asked but because he had difficulty doing the changes, Linda told his rider to accept the change when it was clean even if it wasn't requested. Another commonality was how Linda wanted the whip used. To get the horse to lift his shoulder, Linda had riders tap the horse's shoulder instead of behind the leg. For some horses it was the outside shoulder if they bulged, and for others it was the inside if they fell into the turns.

It was finally Betsy's turn and I watched with earnest because I see her ride on a regular basis. Linda was pleased with where she was and made suggestions to "move up to the next level." Betsy had to go from riding with wide hands, which served to teach the horse contact, to a steady outside rein next to the withers and an inside rein that was only used to assist in turns and to relax the poll. Just this simple fix transformed Betsy's horse from solid training level to a beautiful first-level ride.

Then it was my turn. My normally lazy beastly seemed to have a fire under his butt. Linda ignored his antics and had me focus on my position, which she rightly noticed was the root of all of my horse's issues. She had me do an exercise where I put my weight into the right stirrup while keeping my right hand steady

and low, near the withers, and then switching to put my weight in my left stirrup and setting my left hand. We went back and forth like this around a 20-meter circle a few times and then something amazing happened. Not only did my horse start paying attention, but my position got straighter.

Next she had us canter, which is always a problem for me. To make sure I didn't bang my horse in the mouth, she had me hold onto my bucking strap with my outside rein both during the transition and as we went around the ring. This served to create a steady outside rein. When he still wanted to go through the outside rein, she had me tap him on the shoulder with my outside whip. I ride with two whips because normally he's a slug. I could feel how forward and free he went. It felt incredible.

Betsy and I left with too many directives floating through our heads to make much sense of it all. We both couldn't wait to practice all that we learned and could only hope that we would get our horses going at home half as well as we did at the clinic.

Let's Be Safe Out There

Recently, as I was trying to explain the sport of eventing to some out-of-town friends, the question of safety on cross-country came up. I was able to describe my first experience seeing a frangible pin in action.

Frangible pins have been in use for a decade now, the result of British research into the deadly falls caused when a horse hits the top of a fence above its knee and somersaults with its rider. If the top rail can be fitted with a device that allows it to drop away when hit with a critical downward force, then the horse has a chance to get its front feet on the ground.

In the United States, frangible pins have been compulsory on certain types of fences at the Preliminary level and up since 2010. One type of fence is the coffin, the very combination that caused so much grief for riders at Rolex Kentucky this year: open log fence, down to a ditch, up to a skinny brush. Their difficulties also exposed some of the problems with frangible pins.

The first rider out, New Zealander Andrew Nicholson and Calico Joe, hit the top log with enough force to break the pin, earning them 21 penalty points, one point more than an outright refusal. Because only skilled technicians can replace a pin, there was a lengthy hold before the next rider could start on course. Almost all of the dozen or so horses I watched through the combination brushed the top log, and each time the technicians ran from the sidelines with their tools to examine the pin. When the log came down for Clark Montgomery on Loughan Glen, it was almost an anticlimax. Montgomery continues to maintain that his horse did not hit the log with so much force that the pin should have broken.

Within weeks of Rolex, event riders petitioned the international equestrian federation (FEI) to remove the penalty for breaking a pin. Early in June, the FEI agreed to allow the ground jury at its events to determine penalties on a case-by-case basis. While the FEI continues to postpone implementation of industrial standards for frangible/deformable cross-country devices at its events, it is likely that we will see other technologies employed, such as the MIM NewEra Clip System developed in Sweden. This does not require special expertise to repair.

In the weeks since Jersey Fresh, where a horse was impaled by a broken fence flag, the U.S. Eventing Association proposed new rules about the use of safety flags on certain types of narrow fences. As always, at whatever level, if you see something on cross country that just plain looks wrong, talk to your technical delegate. Other riders will thank you.

Judy Feller, of Effort, PA, has years of various types of experience under her belt! She has been on a horse since she was 3 years old, and started formal lessons when she was only 5 years old! In 1947, her family moved to Pike County, PA, and she has been able to own her own horses since then, except for her horseless years when she was in college. In the past, Judy has trained horses for both English and Western classes. She's also taken driving lessons and broke two horses to harness, as well as taught for three years at a summer riding camp.

Judy became familiar with dressage a long time ago through her love of books; however, she only just began competing in dressage last year. She loves to read and did a lot of reading about dressage before ever stepping into the ring. She also had friends who rode dressage and she would often go to watch them compete. In 1991, while boarding at a farm for the winter that taught dressage, she started taking lessons to help both her and her horse.

In 1999, Judy was introduced to her current horse, Dolly, who is a Quarter Horse cross mare. Judy bought the quiet mare for trail riding, however, in the summer of 2007, Dolly tore a suspensory ligament. In early 2008, as Dolly was beginning to return to work, she was diagnosed with equine motor neuron disease, a Vitamin E and selenium deficiency. It took more than a year for Dolly to fully overcome the effects of the illness and to be comfortably ridden again.

In the fall of 2007, Judy moved Dolly to Hidden Creek Equestrian Center in Kunkletown, PA. Judy has remained at Hidden Creek since then, although she still brings Dolly to her house for the summers. In 2011, Judy competed Dolly at Hidden Creek at Intro A and B. The pair progressed over the season and earned Judy's first ESDCTA award, an Achievement Ribbon for Starter W/T Senior. Judy has already began her 2012 show season with Hidden Creek's May show, where the pair earned a 66% and 68% at Intro A and B. The pair is actively working towards being able to do Intro C and Training 1, and beyond! However, Judy's biggest goal is to keep Dolly sound into her retirement.

Judy really enjoys that, unlike other disciplines, dressage competitions provide ride times. She loves that she knows exactly what time she's competing instead of waiting around all day for the class to be called. Although she loves dressage, her favorite thing to do with Dolly is to go on long trail rides.

Aside from riding, Judy is very busy. Before retiring in 1999, Judy worked as the Government Documents Librarian at East Stroudsburg University. Judy is currently working on several research projects, and she also greatly enjoys photography and playing the piano.

Judy would also like to mention how helpful her husband, Walt, has been with her riding. "Walt has helped care for the horses, driven me to shows, and taken lots of pictures. His assistance and encouragement has been the cornerstones of any success I've had - and he preferred skiing to riding!" 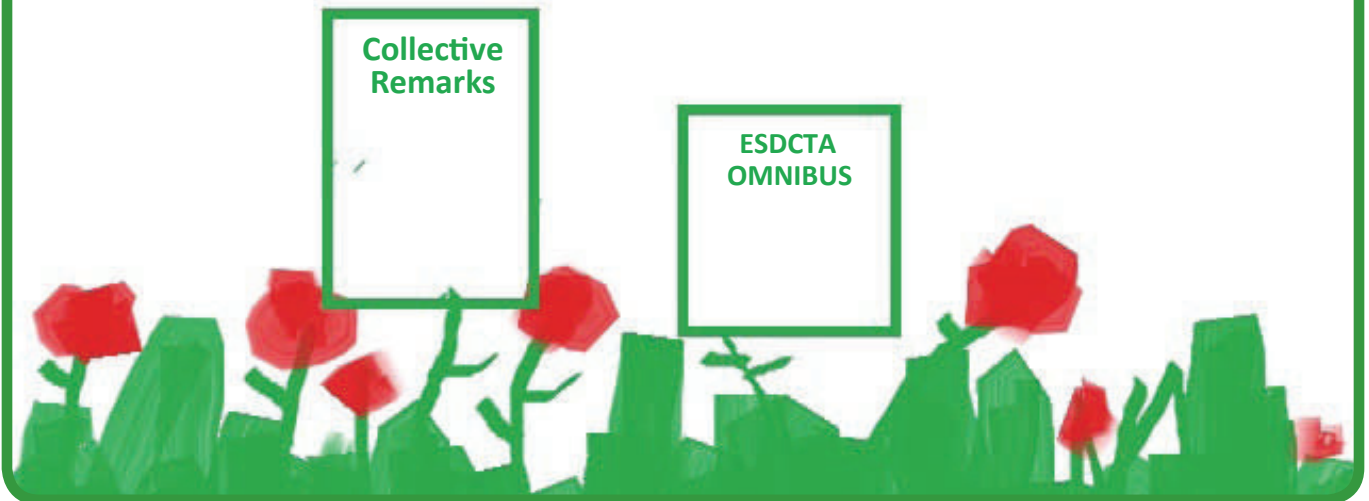

Fun for All at Adult Horsemanship Camp

I had the pleasure of attending horsemanship camp for the first time in my life this past May. The camp was held at East Hill Farm, Plainfield, Vermont. Located 20 minutes outside of Montpelier, Vermont, East Hill Farm provides full professional training facilities and staff. Ruth Hogan-Poulsen bases Poulsen Dressage LLC out of East Hill Farm from May through November. Founders and trainers, Kathie Moulton and Jeannette Hogan, and barn manager and assistant trainer, Caitlin Janus, offer year-round lessons and training at the Farm.

East Hill Farm is also the summer training home of Jane Savoie and many other nationally recognized equestrians. Owned by Hogan-Poulsen, Jeannette Hogan, and Kathie Moulton, the facility has adult horse camp in the spring and in the fall.

Each night after the barn was cleaned, there were cocktails and appetizers while we got to review the day's lesson on CD before dinner. This was a fun bonding and learning experience for all.

I shared accommodations with two fantastic women and made two new horse friends. One was from Iowa and the other was from Missouri, and I hope to see both later this summer. We lodged together to save expenses, but little did we know we would be bonding like college roommates over nonrelated horse experiences in our "old" historic cottage.

During the camp, everyone worked on the same themes but at different levels depending on whether they had their own horse or had to get to know one of the well-trained schoolmasters.

Day 1: Isolation of the aides with Jane Savoie (videotaping) and Ruth Poulsen instructing. I was so petrified of making a mistake with my equitation. The saddle that fit my assigned school horse, Rain, unfortunately did not fit me. It probably did not help that I had an awesome lesson on Rocky the Equisizer with Melissa MacLaren (assistant trainer and barn manager) prior to my lesson. I was so sore; I was

cramping trying to keep my position. Jane also worked with us on position.

Day 2: Geometry and horse stain whitening. Ruth found a school pony that fit my saddle, and we started working on geometry. I had sore muscles that I didn't even know I had. Since I have two paint horses at home I thought I was great at keeping them "as white as possible," but I learned a few new tricks. I also was introduced to a new whitening product that works great.

Day 3: Contact and channeling energy via your aides. The mini clinic was a farrier demonstration/discussion by Bo Poulsen, Ruth's husband and expert farrier. I was so sore at this point that I treated myself to a massage. Ruth told me that I have natural elasticity with my contact but she is not sure I know what to do with it. My pony has taught me what not to do over the years and we keep bad habits just like good habits.

Day 4: Learning how to use the energy to move your horse from behind so you don't have to work so much. It is amazing how our bad habits hold us back. I was reminded about taking too long to make a correction. If the horse does what he is asked, reward. If he does not, reinforce the aide quickly. I have a problem with the execution of quickly. Eight strides, or even three strides is not considered quick enough so we worked on that.

Day Five: Relaxing and riding to tempo. I was so exhausted I planned to use everything I learned to make the ride as smooth as possible. My mount came into my connection quicker and I didn't think so much about my aides. It was so much fun and I learned that you automatically executed aides when you were not thinking about them so much.

I have to say I have never eaten so much in my life and yet lost weight. It took me a good week to recover from my retreat at camp. I had a blast and met so many wonderful people! I highly recommend the experience.

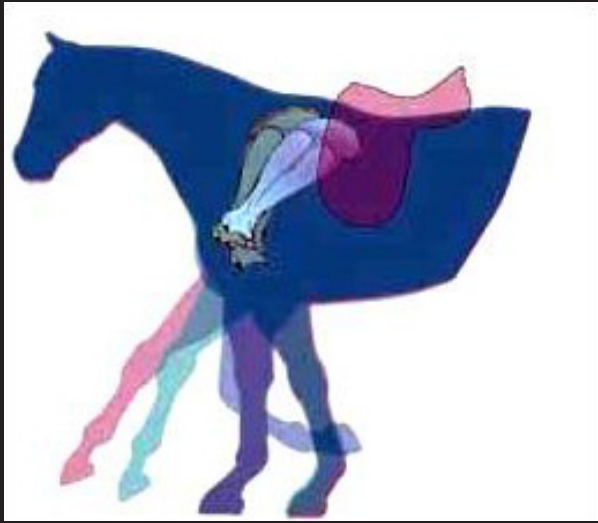

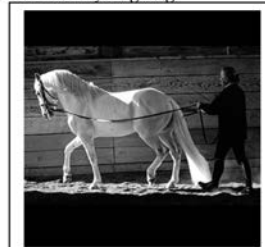

YEH includes an in-hand conformation phase, the YEH dressage test for 4 or 5 year old eventing prospects, and a jumping phase that begins with a few straightforward show jumps, which feed directly into several inviting XC fences. The jumping phase is immediately followed by the galloping phase, in which horses are judged on the quality of the gallop and ability to cover ground.

FEH focuses on judging the potential of yearlings and 2 and 3 year olds to become successful event horses. Horses are judged in hand on their conformation and the quality and correctness of their gaits. They stand for inspection and then walk and trot on a triangle, followed by standing again for the judge's observation.

MODIFIED EVENTING DIVISIONS are an introduction for horses and riders of all ages and equestrian disciplines, whether you or your horse are new to eventing, want to tune up, or try a new level. If entries permit, there will be separate divisions for new event horses, and new event riders. There will be no conformation phase. Levels include:

ELEMENTARY: BN dressage test A; crossrails to 2' jumps
BEGINNER NOVICE: BN test B; 2' -2'7" jumps
NOVICE: Novice test A; 2'7" - 2'11" jumps (YEH 4 y.o. course)
TRAINING: Training test A; 2'11" - 3'3" jumps (YEH 5 y.o. course)


