
All of you Adult Amateur riders should remember to enter the AAHC classes on Friday and Saturday so you can be eligible for a cash award!



HORSE TREATS

I definitely prefer the one "horsepower" of my equine partner to the 225 in my car, but I find it a very strange term when I look at the size of my car compared to my horse (the horse is bigger). The term dates back to when horses still ruled the world. In 1702, Thomas Savery, an English inventor, wrote in The Miner's Friend: "So that an engine which will raise as much water as two horses, working together at one time in such a work, can do…"

James Watt (1736-1819), a Scottish engineer took the concept further to help market his improved steam engine. He discovered that a pony could lift a 100-pound weight at the rate of 220 feet per minute over a four-hour shift, which equals 22,000 foot-pounds per minute (a foot-pound [ft-lb] is the work used to move one pound by one foot). He increased this figure by a half (+11,000 ft-lb) because he thought a horse was 50% more powerful than a pony, and called it one horsepower (33,000 ft-lb per minute = 550 ft-lb per second). He confirmed this by testing a "brewery horse," which he found was able to produce 32,400 ft-lb per minute, and rounded up. Thereby, the definition of one horsepower became the power needed to lift 550 lb by 1 foot in 1 second.

ESDCTA New Jersey Equine Advisory Board Representative

Many of you may not be aware that the STATE OF NJ IS CHARGING SALES TAX ON BOARDING HORSES. They are actively auditing barns in NJ and back charging tax from the fourth quarter of 2006. Training is not taxable, but there are many different scenarios at each and every barn. To answer most questions concerning the details, the best publication seems to be an Informational Guide dated September 3, 2008, by Robert Bruch, Department of Agriculture on Sales & Use Tax concerning horses. You can find it here: http://liberty.state.nj.us/agriculture/pdf/farmingsalesandusetaxguide.pdf. It's about 25 pages of questions and answers. Bob retired last year, but the guide seems to answer more questions than any other information found on the topic. There is also an August 13, 2008 publication by Robert Bruch, which also answers a lot of questions (http://www.escrutgers.com/downloads/Horse_Keeping_Businesses_pdf.8-13-08_(2).pdf).

MANURE MANAGEMENT PLANS are overdue. If you have 8 or more horses, you are now **REQUIRED** to do one. If you have fewer than 8, you are strongly recommended to do one for your own protection. It does not take long to do. You just fill out a form certifying that you have a plan and take the certification to your County Agent. You keep your plan on file at home. It protects you if any neighbors complain about the manure on your property. Contact Lynn Mathews of the State Department of Agriculture for assistance @ 609-292-2888 or Lynn.Mathews@ag.state.NJ.us.

At the NJ Equine Advisory Board, it was suggested that individual farms might want to contact their fire departments to make them more aware of large animal issues. Those who have done this have been well received and the fire departments then know your farm and your situation better, in advance of any emergency.

USDA Farm Service has announced that some equine operations are now eligible for LOW INTEREST LOANS.

Don't forget that with the unseasonable weather that we had over the winter, mosquitos will be out early this year. Act accordingly with your vaccinations.

Rutgers is hosting an Equine Leadership Event at the Meadowlands on April 16. Tickets are \$20.

Competitors!!! Be aware that the calming substance called "Carolina Gold" has been recently banned by the USEF.

EDUCATIONAL OPPORTUNITY - WOW CAMP

The USEA YRAP PROGRAM and the NJ Region Pony Club are co-hosting a youth camp at the Horse Park of New Jersey, August 6-8, 2012. The camp is open to USEA Jr/YR members and current members of the United States Pony Club. As members of ESDCTA, an affiliate member organization of USEA, current ESDCTA youth members are eligible for this camp and ESDCTA youth members are encouraged to attend.

Campers will have the opportunity to refine their eventing skills, dressage Skills, and Pony Club experience with the help of Lynn Symansky, Doug Payne, Sinead Halpin, Jennie Brannigan, Hannah Sue Barnett, Cathy Frederickson, and more. They will also participate in unmounted horse management sessions and various evening activities. This is a great opportunity to learn from the best in an intensive three-day session.

While this camp will focus on eventing for many of those coming, Pony Club is more than eventing. Pony Club has extensive curriculums for the specialties of dressage, show jumping, and our newest track - hunter seat equitation. Instruction will also be offered in these areas for campers who might not be eventing enthusiasts, so there will be a variety of offerings in addition to a first-rate eventing experience.

Day 4 (Thursday, August 9) will offer an Eventing Derby for those who might wish to finish with a competition. This will include a dressage fix-a-test, followed by a combination stadium jumping-cross-country course. Various levels will be offered. Competitors can compete at two consecutive levels if they wish.

Pony Club members can additionally do a club level testing on Day 4 if they wish. Testings will be offered from D2 through C2, all phases (flat, jumping, and horse management).

To round out the week's activities, the NJ Region will also be hosting two workshops for the USEA's ICP (Instruction Certification Program). These workshops will be for Level I/II instructors interested in becoming USEA certified instructors. In order to take the assessment (testing) for this level, candidates must attend these two basic workshops. Instructors can apply to take the workshops; youth and adult members can volunteer to ride as demo riders; and all interested in the ICP program can audit the workshops! Since she has a young horse, she's had to start at the beginning but she enjoys that feeling of accomplishment when they've made enough progress to move on to something new. Practice Makes Perfect: ESDCTA Offers Fix-a-Test Clinics

ESDCTA recently offered youth members the opportunity to participate in two fixa-test clinics. The clinics were well attended and appreciated by riders with diverse experience and goals. The first was held March 3 at Rhythm and Blues Stables in Allentown, NJ. The second was held April 7 at Beaver Creek Equestrian Center in Ringoes, NJ.

Each participant began by riding a dressage test of their choice in front of judge Patti Thompson (March) or Ann Forer (April). The clinician scored each test in the traditional manner. After the ride, Patti or Ann then spent about a half an hour or so working on elements of the test where they saw opportunity for improvement. The clinicians utilized their teaching times in different ways. Ms. Thompson used the test to identify strengths and weaknesses in the horse and rider's performance. She then engaged the student in a very active training session with the overall goal of improving general performance. Ms. Forer focused on breaking down the test into individual components and gave instruction intended to improve the score for each movement. She had each student ride the test for a second time near the end of the session. Afterwards, they discussed the successes and ongoing challenges with the test. While all riders benefited from the individual expertise that was offered at each clinic, those who rode in both clinics found the teaching of both clinicians to be quite complementary and synergistic.

Clinic students varied greatly in their experience, yet they all seemed to learn much from participating. For some, it was an initial outing on a green horse. The riders learned how to deal with underdeveloped steering and distracted mounts. Riders on more seasoned horses gained insight into how to improve performance of their equine partners. Riders and clinicians shared dressage theory and personal experiences during the lunch breaks. Riders also audited the sessions of the other riders. Truly, these clinics provided multifaceted educational opportunities.

Fix-a-test clinics such as these can be quite beneficial to even those riders who have regular access to quality training. Horses often behave differently away from home, and riders may not be ideally equipped to deal with such surprises alone. Clinicians at these events can help riders identify causes of and provide corrections for these less than desirable behaviors. Additionally, clinicians may be able to explain a point to a rider that the regular trainer has been trying to share, but in way that finally reaches the rider. It is common to understand a message when presented in a slightly different way under nonstandard circumstances.

ESDCTA will be hosting one more fix-a-test opportunity. It will be held on May 5, at Hidden Creek Equestrian Center. Kelly Smaltz will be the clinician. Participants will be sure to have a fun and valuable day. Thank you very much ESDCTA for holding these youth clinics!




