Skylands Saddlery and ESDCTA Summer Seminar Series ended with the *History of Dressage*.

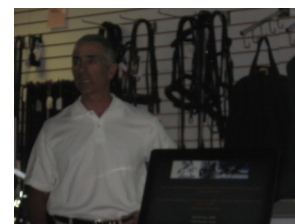
Dr. David Guy, adjunct professor at Delaware Valley College and owner and head trainer of Winchester Farm in Readington, NJ, presented the *History of Dressage*, in August, as the last leg of the Skylands Saddlery and ESDCTA Summer Seminar Series.

"How to Have Fun with Your Horse Again," culminated with Dr. Guy explaining that understanding the training pyramid, its history, and what is expected of the horse at various training stages is key to a rider's knowledge of and success in Dressage. Irene, Irene, Irene. What a mess!

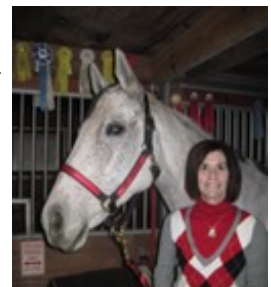
We managed to pull through the wrath of the storm. Some did better than others. Others did worse.

I was more prepared for my horses and animals than anything else. I figured I would survive but I was concerned about water, so my barn was filled with it. I have learned to regularly store bottles of water in my barn after a traffic light near us went down and we were all of a sudden without it. Unbeknownst to her, a boarder soaped up her entire horse before realizing why the hose was not working. I ran to the store and got gallons of water to help her. You guessed it! Just as I pulled into the driveway with the water, the water came back on. But I learned my lesson. It has also come in handy for horse shows and dog shows.

Thanks to Irene, we were without power for a week, and the telephone and internet did not come back on until days after that. I had to keep reminding myself that people were doing worse than I, and that people all over the world were experiencing the horrors of war and the like.

But right here in our region, people experienced flooding in their homes and lost more than my refrigerator and freezer full of food. They had to evacuate and find housing elsewhere or use one of the many shelters that were created. There were some horse owners who had to ship their horses off to other barns. There were people with animals that needed special care, which demanded power.

When I lived through a similar hurricane in Virginia, we had to leave home when the power did not come on for more than a week. Fortunately, my dear friend took us in: two adults, four kids, two dogs, two cats, and four parrots. Now, that's a good friend! But not everyone has that kind of support system. And people with animals can have a very difficult time finding refuge from such disasters. We remember Katrina and the stories of so many pets lost or abandoned because people were unable to care for them when trying to cope with their own survival.

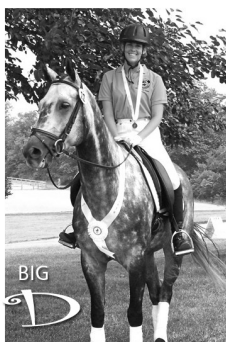
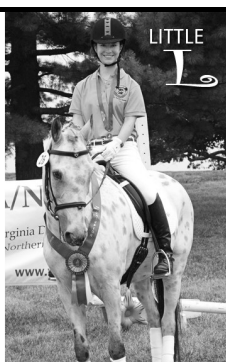

ON THE BIT

ESDCTA Trainers ' Tips, Advice, and Observations

Avoiding Frustration in the Pursuit of Perfection

We've all been there... your horse performed all of the First Level work amazingly well for you yesterday but today can't seem to give you even one decent walk-trot transition without throwing his head in the air and snatching at the bit. The horse must be (choose one): a) mad at you for something; b) being stubborn for no apparent reason but to give you low self-esteem; or c) ill and in need of immediate veterinary care! I propose that there is an alternative answer – he's simply being a horse!

Horses don't share our love for the perfect transition, or the round circle, or the flowing half-pass. Their needs and desires are much more simplistic – they want to be safe, well fed, and well cared for. Most horses will choose on most days to work with us for those above-mentioned needs to be satisfied. That said, there are days when they would much rather be out in the field playing with their friends or eating grass, and on those days it is our job as riders and trainers to convince them of the benefits of working with us even when they don't want to do so.

In order to be successful and to avoid frustration in our sport, we must never take the horse's negative behavior personally. Rarely does a horse behave badly out of malice directed towards an individual unless he has been provoked to do so. Provocation, however, can come from unclear aids or inappropriate corrections, so we must be very conscious of our actions. For the horse to know what we want from them, we must clearly know what that is ourselves. Then, we must know how to tell the horse to do it, make appropriate corrections when the horse does not respond correctly, and give praise and reward when he does.

For example, if a horse is running through our hands, it would not be an appropriate correction to tap him with the whip, yet as a judge, competitor, and trainer I often see this done. The rider will say "He's not paying attention to me, so I tapped him to get his attention." While that may make sense to a human, to the horse you just said "Get off my leg and go more forward," which is *not* your intent. If a horse is fussy in the bridle, you must use steady, elastic hands to help him find the correct connection, yet often riders become frustrated and begin snatching on the reins instead. This only serves to create more distrust in the contact for the horse.

If we are to develop a more harmonious partnership with our horses we must remain both flexible and consistent. We must be flexible enough to alter our training plans on any given day to meet the mental and physical needs our horse brings to the table. If we planned to school leg-yields and lengthenings, but our horse comes out tense and above the bit, it may take an entire schooling session just to get him relaxed and on our aids. That's okay. No frustration, just flexibility. On the other hand, we must be consistent in our expectations. We cannot punish a horse for being lazy in the trot if we let him poke around the ring at a deadman's march in the walk. We cannot be upset if they break off our circles if we never set limits on the size and shape of the circle we want.

All too often we forget that our partner in this sport is an animal who does not share our training and/or competing agenda. The horse just wants to be cared for and loved. They work with us out of grace. The next time you find yourself getting frustrated because your Fourth Level horse suddenly forgot how to canter, remember that even horses are entitled to a bad day. Try listening to him and figure out how to help him do what you are asking. It is your job to figure out where the problem lies and to help him overcome it. In a partnership both sides must bring equal amounts to the table; however, when only one is human, it is that partner's responsibility to take care of both. So, leave the frustration behind in your pursuit of perfection or you may miss those perfect moments!

ESDCTA Youth Compete at Difficult Run Horse Trial in Virginia, August, 2011 "We Were A Team"

ESDCTA fielded a youth team to the Difficult Run Horse Trial (DRHT) in Herdon, Virginia on August 22, 2011. This was the first youth team we sent to a recognized horse trial and the members who qualified for the team were very excited for the opportunity to participate and represent our membership. Our team consisted of Christy Pellegrino, Grace Lutfy, and Sofie Lutfy. Tricia Lutfy was our Chef d'equipe, and she was honored to watch our youth members become a unit so quickly. After some issues with the GPS, everyone had arrived by late afternoon on Saturday, and the unpacking and setting up of stalls began. All of the horses had the opportunity to take a hack near the dressage warm up and discover the cows that lived in residence next to the dressage ring where their tests were to be ridden the next morning. It was an excellent bonding time to relax the horses, who were thinking "who are these strange creatures?" Slowly but surely, the cows lost their distractive quality and the girls worked through their first endeavor as a team. It was apparent from the start that we were all there to support one another.

We were a TEAM.

We settled the horses, the tackroom, and the details of setting up the team schedule, and then headed out to walk the cross country course. The course walk showed a cross country course that was encroached by suburban sprawl. It may have been less than we expected from a "Virginia XC course," but the team was still very excited to run the course and compete on behalf of ESDCTA.

We were a team, set with our schedule in hand as we departed for a short trip to our hotel. There were many restaurants to choose from and we all enjoyed a good meal and soon were off to sleep. Our arrival back to the Frying Pan Park was a very civilized 7:30am.

We were a team during the morning of braiding and preparing, which went without a hitch and all of the members had time for a second cross country walk and a stadium course walk before their dressage tests. The girls all had good dressage tests. Grace Lutfy was the low score for the Novice division with a 26.5 and Sofie Lutfy and Christy Pelligerino tied with a score of 35.7. The individual scores didn't matter, we were a team.

Frying Pan Park is a county-owned park and therefore you have foot traffic from some non-horsey guests. It was important for all of the members to acclimate themselves and the horses to this setting. The stadium jump course was challenging and had many very decorative fences. On the grounds there was also a functioning merry-go-round running during the show. The organizers were sensitive to this and offered any competitor to wait to jump during a break when the merry-go-round was not running. The organizers and show staff were very helpful and welcoming. The barns were very nice, with all of the necessary comforts, a rather new facility in a centrally located area.

As the day moved on, the weather became a bit of a concern, and as can often happen at a competition, suddenly we were all moving a bit faster in hopes of getting through both jumping phases before the looming thunderstorms prevented us from completing the horse trial. We were a team and we worked together as if we had been a team for longer than the one day we had been together. The stadium phase demanded a strategy and as a team we discussed the plan. Rain rolled in during the show jump warm up and we needed to get warmed up quickly to get into the ring and compete. The team got down to business in the busy warm up arena and we were ready to go with back-to-back stadium and cross country. We agreed that Tricia would stay with the stadium phase until each member was complete and as the team completed that phase they would go and run cross country.

The stadium phase presented a few issues for the Lutfy girls and Christy pulled off a difficult clear SJ round. We were a team. The team all went clear cross country as the sky opened up and the rain pelted down, but we were gratefully done with all three phases of the horse trial. Christy ended up third overall individually and the team was awarded third place, but again it didn't matter – we were a team. The best part of the experience for all of us was that WE WERE A TEAM! Thank you ESDCTA Youth Committee for the opportunity.

Why do you want to do the job you are nominated for?

When I said I would run for President last year, my goals included improving communication, engaging more volunteers, and I had a serious focus on providing our members with educational opportunities, as education is our organization's mission. I believe I have accomplished getting us on the right track. Our newsletter consistently informs our members about what is happening in the combined training and dressage communities. We have also begun to provide e-news to our members on a regular basis. What we have done differently this year is to allow volunteers who have an interest in a particular program to organize it, without having to work year-round on the Education Committee. Thereby, we have had webinars, clinics, and seminars scheduled throughout the year. This past year, we have also succeeded in making the Memorial Day Weekend Show not only a great competition opportunity, but we included two educational programs: a seminar on horse psychology and *Dressage with the Experts*. Next year's calendar already includes even more programming. But I don't feel my work is finished. I think we just got started and, having learned the ropes, can do even more. In addition, we are already looking at the possibility of incorporating a clinic at one of our combined training competitions. The more we can excite the public about what we do, the more sponsorship we will get to support our members in what they expect from our organization.

What experience do you have working in groups to solve problems either in business or in volunteer organizations like ESDCTA?

I have owned several businesses and have had to solve problems that may occur daily or infrequently but are always demanding of your fullest attention, whether it be staffing or budgetary matters. I also have worked for non-profit organizations, currently employed as the Literacy Services Program and Volunteer Coordinator for Hunterdon Helpline, Inc. I am attending Rutgers University to receive my certification in Non-Profit and Public Management, which has included courses in budget and financing, volunteer management, and leadership skills. All of this, but especially my hands-on experience as a volunteer in many different organizations, doing jobs from within committees to that of the President, I believe provides me with skill sets and understanding of volunteer organizations necessary to pursue success for ESDCTA.

Vice President: Debbie DelGiorno

What volunteer work have you done for ESDCTA in the last few years?

I became an active volunteer with ESDCTA when my daughter started to compete at rated dressage shows, volunteering in various tasks from ring steward to scoring. In 2007, I assumed the responsibilities of Corresponding Secretary and held the position of Secretary from 2008-2010. I currently hold the position of Vice President, and in this capacity have restructured the Youth Committee to allow for the expansion of youth programs currently offered to our membership. Additionally, I have helped with the initial implementation of our re-designed newsletter. I have helped in the areas of education by initiating and organizing the *Dressage with the Experts* and guest speaker, sports psychologist, Dr. Jenny Susser, at this year's Memorial Weekend Competition. I have also represented our GMO by proxy delegate to the USDF Board of Governor's annual meeting in 2008 and 2009.

Why do you want to do the job you are nominated for?

I would like to continue to contribute to the Club's mission of education and building membership while improving transparency and communication within our organization.

What ideas do you have for doing the job you are nominated for?

I would like to further expand our youth programs and through benchmarking evaluate and: 1) improve the ways we communicate within and outside our Club, 2) extend the benefits we offer our membership, and 3) increase our revenue through advertising and sponsorship, which will allow us to further our commitment to education.

Treasurer: Marsha Montgomery

Please provide a very brief bio about your experience with horsemanship:

My first equine was the traditional spotted pony with a western saddle. I progressed through saddle seat riding (as much of that as you can do on a Welsh pony) and hunters to dressage. I have owned my Thoroughbred mare, Chessie, for 25 years. Chessie helped me earn my USDF Bronze Medal. Chessie's daughter, Maddie (aka Hakuna Matata), is my latest (challenging) project, but I managed to earn the 2nd Level (having ridden above 2nd) Championship at ESDCTA's 2010 Dressage Schooling Championships. I am also an L graduate.

What volunteer work have you done with ESDCTA in the last few years?

I have served on the ESDCTA Board for about eight years as Secretary, Vice-President, President, and Nominating Chair. I have spent many days volunteering for ESDCTA, NEDA, and the USEF Dressage Festival of Champions, including being the Volunteer Manager for the Festival for 2009-2011, and a volunteer coordinator for one of ESDCTA's Memorial Weekend Dressage shows. For years I have been volunteering for at least one of the ESDCTA dressage shows if not both. I have also scored at the Horse Trials and served many years on the Board.

Why do you think you can do the job you are nominated for?

I hold a degree in accounting and I am a (non-practicing) CPA. I am very comfortable with numbers, and I am well organized. I even balance my checkbook every month! In addition, I have 30+ years in business working with teams and solving problems (nothing ever goes smoothly), plus 10 years on the board of the Somerset Home for Temporarily Displaced Children as Board Secretary, Strategic Planning Committee Chair, and past Auction Chair. I have also spent two years as Volunteer Manager for the USEF Dressage Festival of Champions.

Secretary: BethAnn Adams**Please provide a very brief bio about your experience with horsemanship.**

I resumed my life with horses and riding after the busy years of parenting and successfully getting my two children off to college. I tried Western riding (too calm), and Hunter/Jumpers (too scary) before finding Dressage. I devoured books on the subject, and went to every local show. I soon bought my first horse, Monty, a retired steeplechaser with a great “go” button. I gained much from my short years with Monty, like how to care for a horse, how to use my senses more than my emotions, how to be a patient teacher, and when to adjust my needs for the well being of another creature. Unfortunately, Monty suffered a heart attack and I ended up donating him to New Bolton for heart research. Along came Pendragon (“Peppie”), my current horse who is an imported Hanoverian from premium bloodlines. He was just 4 years old and green broke when he became my new partner. While riding Peppie I was both a teacher and a student of Dressage. I learned that subtle aids and consistency is the key to successful training. We have represented the ESDCTA in several competitions, and I was among some of the first riders to be awarded the USDF/Dover National Merit Award for high scores at Second Level Test 2. Peppie is 21 years old now, and we no longer do the show circuit because he has vision problems. I currently ride several days a week and have been working on 3rd level movements with my friend and instructor, Cheryl Ash.

What volunteer work have you done with ESDCTA in the last few years?

I’ve been Show Secretary for ESDCTA Dressage Championships for the past three years. I’ve also been an active volunteer for many organizations over the years, including the Festival of Champions, ESDCTA, DVHA, LVDA, Dressage at Devon, and the Region 15 Arabian club. Mostly, I enjoy the work as scribe. During the past few years I’ve been working along side Terry Masters on the ESDCTA Dressage Committee. Recently, I’ve been busy teaching the fundamentals of the Fox Village Dressage program to this year’s Championship Show Secretary, Dr. Lisa Toaldo.

What ideas do you have for doing the job you are nominated for?

I would like to be Secretary for ESDCTA because I’m interested in becoming active on the Board level. I’d like to keep up with the functioning of our Club so I can be more informed. As Show Secretary I’ve enjoy working on a personal basis with the competitors and feel that being Club Secretary will help me address these needs better. This year our Club has improved its outreach efforts by incorporating fund raising for the Kessler Research Foundation, by the educational activities held at Skyland Saddlery, and by offering better quality competitions in the local area. I’d like to help the Club continue to be an active organization within the equestrian community.

Member At Large (Dressage): Jessie Steiner**Please provide a very brief bio about your experience with horsemanship.**

I have worked as barn manager and trainer at Betsy Steiner Dressage (BSD) since 1995. I have competed in national competitions & CDI’s in California, Florida, Illinois, Canada (NAYRC 1992) and the Northeast. While in California I competed in the Festival of Champions at Gladstone, I also worked for the organization that put on the first World Cup held in the US in 1995. We moved to New Jersey in 2001, where I have trained numerous clients and horses in all levels of dressage from kids in Pony Club to Grand Prix. BSD has a number of show horses that compete both nationally and internationally, and I work to coordinate all aspects of their care and scheduling. I also run the clinics that BSD holds throughout the year.

What volunteer work have you done with ESDCTA in the last few years?

This is my first year as a member of ESDCTA. This year I have served as the Club’s representative for the NJ Equine Advisory Board. In addition, our business has sponsored shows and awards for several years, and we gave one of the talks at Skylands Saddlery this summer.

What ideas do you have for doing the job you are nominated for?

I would talk with competitors and other members for their feedback on what they are looking for and ways to improve the club. I would help in bringing in clinicians and other individuals who would be interesting and educational for the Club, at large. I am also happy to help out wherever I am needed!

Member At Large (Eventing) – Carey Williams**Please provide a very brief bio about your experience with horsemanship.**

I am the Equine Extension Specialist and an Assistant Professor at Rutgers, the State University of New Jersey and the Equine Science Center, a position I have held since July 2003. As the Extension Specialist, I facilitate and coordinate programs for the equine industry, including multistate and multidisciplinary equine education and research programs. I earned my doctorate degree in animal and poultry sciences (with an emphasis on equine nutrition and exercise physiology) in June 2003 from Virginia Polytechnic Institute and State University. I graduated as a C2 from *Ride with Pride* Pony Club in Northern Wisconsin, competing in Eventing rallies on mixed club teams from Upper Michigan and Minnesota. My partner was a 15 hh, Appaloosa/Quarter Horse, named Annie, who was the same age as me. Annie was an open show horse whose favorite event was barrels, and through a lot of hard work and hard falls, I turned her into an eventer - not an easy task since I was also on the steep part of the Eventing learning curve! I now compete a 13-yr-old TB mare, “Mickie,” who I purchased from my research herd at Virginia Tech as a yearling. After years of squeezing training and competing into my busy schedule, we currently compete at Preliminary Level, and hope to one day compete in a 1-star event. Recently, I took on an off-the-track TB as a project horse; Skip is a 5-yr old 17-hh event prospect who is currently learning how to have fun being a horse. My other hobbies (when I’m not riding) include skiing, hiking, biking, rollerblading, and other nice-weather outdoor sports.

What volunteer work have you done with ESDCTA in the last few years?

I have been a member of the Eventing Committee for the past several years. I also encourage my Rutgers students to volunteer at ESDCTA events for “extra credit”. This has helped greatly with staffing the NJ Horse Trials!

The rat is of the order Rodentia, which is characterized by having two continuously growing incisors in the upper and lower jaws, and is nothing similar to the horse. Camels, rhinoceroses, deer, and horses are all ungulates, which are animals that use the tips of their toes (usually hoofed) to sustain their whole body weight while moving. However, camels and deer are members of the order Artiodactyla, meaning they have an even number of toes. Horses are members of the order Perissodactyla, which are odd-toed ungulates. Only the rhinoceros is also a member of the order Perissodactyla, so the answer is **B**.

Time for Year End Awards!

The show season is almost over and it's time to start getting scores and volunteer hours together for 2011 Year-End Awards. Show season started on November 11, 2010, and will end on October 31, 2011. Keep in mind:

High Score Awards: there are new requirements for 2011!

Starter W/T and W/T/C: 5 scores/4 different judges/
3 different shows

Training-Fourth: 5 scores=3 from the highest test of the level from 3 different judges/4 different judges overall/
3 different shows

Designations: *Dressage:* Junior/Amateur/Open;
Eventing: Junior/Senior

Master Recognition Awards: Qualifying age is 50 years, open only to Adult Amateurs in both Dressage and Eventing. This is *not* a "Stand Alone Award" but an additional award for High Score Awards submissions.

Starter Rider: The day a rider competes at Training Level, Test 2 or above they are *no longer* a starter rider. Scores prior to that day may be used towards Starter Rider Year-End Awards.

Championship Show/Classes: Scores earned in Championship classes or Championship shows sanctioned by ESDCTA may be used for Year-End Awards. If two tests were ridden and then combined to achieve a final score, only the final score may be used. If a test was ridden under two judges and the scores were averaged, only the final score may be used. However, both judge's names may be used to satisfy the judge requirement.

General Awards: Nominations – please refer to the Omnibus for full details.

Tests: Please save all of your tests. Do not send the original tests! No email or fax entries accepted. Award entries must be complete with copies of tests attached to each entry. In the case of lost tests, please use USEA or USDF print-outs or have the show secretary write a confirmation letter.

Volunteer Hours: 8 hours of volunteer time is required for each award – except for Master Recognition Award.

Membership: Applicant must have been a member in good standing at the time scores were earned and when applying for an award.

November 5 is the deadline for Year-End Award submissions. They must be complete and **post-marked** no later than this date. No late entries will be accepted.

Awards will be presented at the annual ESDCTA Year-End Awards Banquet. Please refer to the omnibus for full details about each award category. Any questions can be sent via email to awards@esdcta.com.


