## PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

When the Extreme Mustang Makeover was coming for the first time to the East Coast, and right in our own state at the Dream Park in Gloucester County, it was field trip time for me and my boarders!

The competition is a two-day event with trainers who have signed up to train a wild mustang through the Mustang Heritage Foundation and the US Bureau of Land Management adoption program. Trainers get 90 days to train their mustang before showing off the results at the competition. They receive a stipend to "help" with the costs, but basically they are on their own and the purse money is reserved for the winners. On the day after the competition, the horses go to auction and the trainers wanting to keep their mounts must bid equally with the general public.

For the first two days, the rider and horse compete in a series of exercises testing the horse's disposition, rideability and willingness; walk, trot, canter, and over ground poles, you name it. The final competition is a freestyle for the ten finalists. They can show their horses off in any way they wish. Some of the trainers choose to concentrate on rideability with flying changes, leg yields, and jumping, while others get creative using props and obstacles. Either way, after 90 days of training these once-wild horses are mounts that we all would be thrilled to own.

When we were there, the documentary about the project was being advertised. It was being premiered at a theater in Manhattan. "Field trip!" we all shouted.

Two weeks later, we were sitting in the theater watching "Wild Horses, Wild Ride." The added icing on the cake to this wonderful movie, was the Q&A that followed with the director and producer and some of the actual trainers featured in the movie. Awesome!

But more importantly, it made us all ask the question: If these people had their horses for 90 days and were able to accomplish what they did (BTW, many had second jobs, so no excuses), what had we accomplished with our own horses that we have owned for years?

Well, after 90 days, these horses were not my hot, Thoroughbred mare. But I was intrigued. What had I taught my own horse, if anything? Was it just to ride in the arena and learn different movements that sometimes only frustrated the two of us? Did we have any special connection that these trainers had with their mustangs?

After one particularly trying ride, I got off my mare, hiked up the stirrups and rolled the reins so they didn't flop. I started walking, waiting to see if she would follow. She did. Well, that was too easy. So, with the arena gate wide open, I decided to try some exercises I do with my dogs when they compete in rally, a series of movements and commands with the dog at "heel." I walked, she walked. I trotted, she trotted, I trotted over ground poles and so did she. She never left my side. I never touched her other than to tell her she was a good girl when we had halted. Funny thing, this horse that can run away with me, simply stopped when I stopped. To describe what happened can only be summed up in my son's surprised face as he watched. "Are you kidding me? I never saw you do that with her. How long have you been doing that? That is amazing."

One answer would have been, just today. But when I think about it, the real answer is that I had been doing it for years, and just didn't know it. I always liked to think she loved me as I loved her but I never really knew if there was a real bond. I was always so wrapped up in success as being another dressage movement mastered that I didn't realize all of the other things we had accomplished. And now, to do all of that when I am in the saddle! Go see "Wild Horses, Wild Ride" and come home to your own success!

Don't worry if you break a mirror or spill salt. Just lead a horse through the house and any misfortune can be averted.

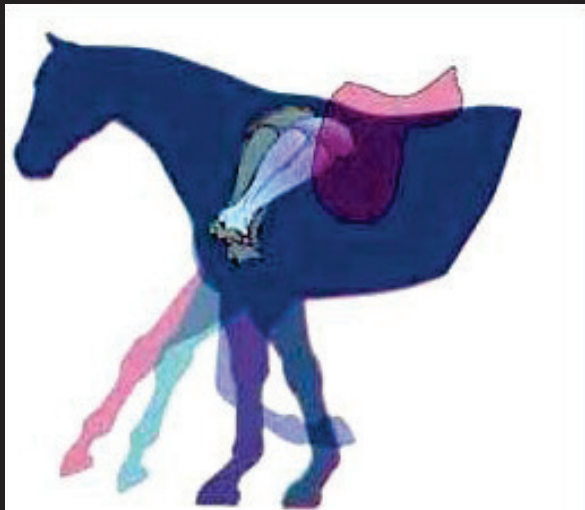
To avoid bad luck if you see a white dog you should stay silent until you see a white horse.

**President: Susan Lax**

***1. Please provide a very brief bio about your experience with horsemanship:***

I began riding as a child, beginning formal lessons at age eleven. While I rode on a regular basis, I worked in stables wherever I could, catching rides, mucking out, and doing whatever I could to get training outside the once-a-week hour paid for by my parents. I finally got my own horse at the age of eighteen and did everything I could to keep him while going to college and leaving home for a job and—the real world. I knew then that the passion would never leave me, even when I was blessed with quadruplets and had to put the horses on the back burner for awhile. I have shown hunter/jumpers, given lessons, bought and sold sport horses and had a small horse breeding program with my husband. My interest in Dressage began about eight years ago with my beloved Chevy who has been shown through second level and is an AHS Main Stud Book Approved TB mare. I hope to have a small breeding program once again.

***2. What volunteer work have you done with ESDCTA in the last few years?***

When I first ran for President, following my 3 terms as Vice President, my goals included improving communication and engaging more volunteers. I had a serious focus on providing our members with educational opportunities, as education is our organization's mission. I believe we have accomplished that, with seminars, webinars and the inclusion of such programs at our shows. I serve on the newsletter committee as well as the new web site design committee and send out the e-news to our members. I have also volunteered at shows and the cross country schooling put on by our eventing committee.

***3. Why do you want to do the job you are nominated for?***

I have one more year, if the membership allows me, to finish the goals I began in 2011. I think the board has made incredible strides the past two years. The youth chairs have expanded its programming, offering a cadre of opportunities for our young people to keep them learning as well as connected to our club and seeking future leadership roles. Our Dressage shows have also expanded, including educational opportunities for the audience as well as increased hospitality for our competitors. The eventing committee has been successful in offering new schooling opportunities and the horse trials have improved, with more people entering. The new web site has exciting new features and will be a wonderful member benefit. Most importantly, we have grown our education opportunities which is, again, our ultimate mission and benefit to our members. All these successes motivate me to continue to work shoulder to shoulder with fellow members who have a passion for this club and the vision to make it better and better.

***4. What ideas do you have for doing the job you are nominated for?***

With all that we have accomplished, there are still things we could be doing to give our members from both disciplines great learning and competing opportunities. This year we have seen a growth in membership every month from the previous years. I'd like to engage even more members, particularly on the eventing side since those numbers are not what they were years ago. ***5. Why do you think you can do the job you are nominated for?***

The people I work with on the board have stepped up to every challenge, every issue, every recommendation with a commitment of "it will be done," not just "it can be done." In such a partnership, I am always inspired to bring my best to the collaboration.

***6. What experience do you have working groups to solve problems in either business or in volunteer organizations like ESDCTA?***

My professional life is all about non-profits and volunteers. I am Director of Volunteers for a non-profit organization in Flemington and recently graduated the certificate program for Non-profit and Public Management from Rutgers University. In addition, I have and still own businesses which gives me a great background in understanding the nuts and bolts of any organization.



**Vice President: Debbie DelGiorno****1. What volunteer work have you done for ESDCTA in the last few years?**

I became an active volunteer with ESDCTA when my daughter started to compete at rated dressage shows, volunteering in various tasks from ring steward to scoring. In 2007, I assumed the responsibilities of Corresponding Secretary and held the position of Secretary from 2008-2010. I currently hold the position of Vice President, and in this capacity have restructured the Youth Committee to allow for the expansion of youth programs currently offered to our membership. Additionally, I have helped with the initial implementation of our re-designed newsletter. I have helped in the areas of education by initiating and organizing the Dressage with the Experts and guest speakers at our Memorial Weekend Dressage Competition. I have also represented our GMO by proxy delegate to the USDF Board of Governor's annual meeting in 2008 and 2009.

**2. Why do you want to do the job you are nominated for?**

I would like to continue to contribute to the Club's mission of education and building membership while improving transparency and communication within our organization.

**3. What ideas do you have for doing the job you are nominated for?**

I would like to further expand our youth programs and through benchmarking evaluate and: 1) improve the ways we communicate within and outside our Club, 2) extend the benefits we offer our membership, and 3) increase our revenue through advertising and sponsorship, which will allow us to further our commitment to education.

**Treasurer: Mary Moon****1. Please provide a very brief bio about your experience with horsemanship**

I grew up in northwest Pennsylvania and started taking riding lessons (Western, then hunt seat) at age 7. My family joined the Erie Hunt and Saddle Club (EHSC): my parents served on the Board and I painted stadium jumps, "ran" scores sheets, helped "flag" and prepare the cross country courses, and fence judged. I leased a school horse when I was 15 years old and my parents bought my first horse a year later. A dedicated dressage instructor helped me train this headstrong athletic gelding. I joined Lost Hounds Pony Club (LHPC), rallied (stable manager) as a D-2 and earned my C-1. This horse, Charlemagne, was the EHSC Reserve Champion Horse of the Year and I was delighted to receive a Horsemastership Award from LHPC. I sold Charlie when I came East to Lafayette College in Easton, PA, where I rode hunt seat in IHSA (Intercollegiate Horse Shows Association) competitions, went to Regionals and Nationals, and served as an officer of the Riding Club. Then I went on the University of Chicago and sailed, rowed, ran, and swam.

I resumed riding when I worked in Paris, France. I took dressage and jumping lessons at the Touring Club stables and hacked through the Bois de Boulogne, a huge park. This was a great opportunity to ride dozens of different school horses. Living in Europe I inhaled the horse atmosphere and spent my weekends going to CDIs, CCIs, CSOs, World Cup Jumping, Badminton, Luhmuhlen, Saumur, and so forth.

I returned to the States and worked in R&D in Cleveland. There I took dressage lessons at Lake Erie College (LEC) and I worked my way up the ladder of school horses as I learned tempi changes, canter pirouettes, counter change of hand, and all the lateral movements. I bought Wizard and campaigned him at First Level at LEC and Northern Ohio Dressage Association (NODA) shows. We were NODA champs at First Level, competed at Regionals, captained a team that won the LEC Team de Ville and won several national awards. I volunteered as a scribe and helped with hospitality for NODA.

Then, I moved to the Philadelphia area and joined ESDCTA, where I rescued an OTTB mare and brought her along in dressage. Unfortunately, she developed severe anhidrosis and it was necessary to put her down.

**2. What volunteer work have you done with ESDCTA in the last few years?**

I've volunteered as a scribe and fence judge, and written a few articles for the newsletter. I was thrilled to receive a Volunteer of the Year Award from ESDCTA several years ago. I continued all of these volunteer activities even though I put riding "on hold" while I got my MBA and focused on my career.

**3. Why do you want to do the job you are nominated for?**

I want to do the treasury job because I can balance this role with my other responsibilities. Also I enjoy working with numerical data, analyzing models, and producing reports.

**4. What ideas do you have for doing the job you are nominated for?**

I want to propose to the Board that I prepare several types of reports for the membership. First, I'd like to have some financial information available on our website that will give members the opportunity to understand the Club's expenses, income and financial goals. These reports could be charts that show percentages, such as the percentages of income from membership dues, shows, events and so forth. Second, I'd like to provide information to support those who solicit and make donations to support our events. This information would focus on the ways that the Club serves the greater good and contributes time, resources, and money to New Jersey Horse Park, United States Equestrian Team, the Christopher Reeve Foundation, and so forth.

**5. Why do you think you can do the job you are nominated for?**

I have a good reputation as a scribe because I'm conscientious, reliable and discreet. Now I'm excited about supporting ESDCTA as the Treasurer. My business courses in accounting and finance and my analytic/computer work as a scientist are good preparation for this role.

**6. What experience do you have working groups to solve problems in either business or in volunteer organizations like ESDCTA?**

I've been a lifelong member and volunteer to a number of horse organizations, from the Erie Hunt and Saddle Club and Lost Hounds Pony Club, Lafayette College Riding Club, and Northern Ohio Dressage Association to ESDCTA. I've been a volunteer and leader in these organizations. Most recently I've served as a volunteer and leader of a professional organization, the Philadelphia Section of the Society of Tribologists and Lubrication Engineers. As Education Chair and Section Chair I've lead efforts to increase the number of Education Meetings and attendance, and the contributions to the scholarship program. In these organizations, as in the business world, I've learned a bit about the art of maintaining congenial working relationships with colleagues, customers, and

suppliers. If enough people communicate and work with one another, then the problems often resolve themselves.

**Secretary: BethAnn Adams**

**1. Please provide a very brief bio about your experience with horsemanship**

I resumed my life with horses and riding after the busy years of parenting and successfully getting my two children off to college. I tried Western riding (too calm), and Hunter/Jumpers (too scary) before finding Dressage. I devoured books on the subject, and went to every local show. I soon bought my first horse, Monty, a retired steeplechaser with a great "go" button. I gained much from my short years with Monty, like how to care for a horse, how to use my senses more than my emotions, how to be a patient teacher, and when to adjust my needs for the well being of another creature. Unfortunately, Monty suffered a heart attack, and I ended up donating him to New Bolton for heart research. Along came Pendragon ("Peppie"), my current horse who is an imported Hanoverian from premium bloodlines. He was just 4 years old and green broke when he became my new partner. While riding Peppie I was both a teacher and a student of Dressage. I learned that subtle aids and consistency is the key to successful training. We have represented the ESDCTA in several competitions, and I was among some of the first riders to be awarded the USDF/ Dover National Merit Award for high scores at Second Level Test 2. Peppie is 21 years old now, and we no longer do the show circuit because he has vision problems. I currently ride several days a week and have been working on 3rd level movements with my friend and instructor, Cheryl Ash.

**2. What volunteer work have you done with ESDCTA in the last few years?**

I've been Show Secretary for ESDCTA Dressage Championships for the past three years. I've also been an active volunteer for many organizations over the years, including the Festival of Champions, ESDCTA, DVHA, LVDA, Dressage at Devon, and the Region 15 Arabian club. Mostly, I enjoy the work as scribe. During the past few years I've been working along side Terry Masters on the ESDCTA Dressage Committee. Recently, I've been busy teaching the fundamentals of the Fox Village Dressage program to this year's Championship Show Secretary, Dr. Lisa Toaldo.

**3. What ideas do you have for doing the job you are nominated for?**

I would like to be Secretary for ESDCTA because I'm interested in becoming active on the Board level. I'd like to keep up with the functioning of our Club so I can be more informed. As Show Secretary I've enjoy working on a personal basis with the competitors and feel that being Club Secretary will help me address these needs better. This year our Club has improved its outreach efforts by incorporating fund raising for the Kessler Research Foundation, by the educational activities held at Skyland Saddlery, and by offering better quality competitions in the local area. I'd like to help the Club continue to be an active organization within the equestrian community.

**Member At Large (Dressage): Jessie Steiner**

**1. Please provide a very brief bio about your experience with horsemanship**

I have worked as barn manager and trainer at Betsy Steiner Dressage (BSD) since 1995. I have competed in national competitions & CDI's in California, Florida, Illinois, Canada (NAYRC 1992) and the Northeast. While in California I competed in the Festival of Champions at Gladstone, I also worked for the organization that put on the first World Cup held in the US in 1995. We moved to New Jersey in 2001, where I have trained numerous clients and horses in all levels of dressage from kids in Pony Club to Grand Prix. BSD has a number of show horses that compete both nationally and internationally, and I work to coordinate all aspects of their care and scheduling. I also run the clinics that BSD holds throughout the year.

**2. What volunteer work have you done with ESDCTA in the last few years?**

What volunteer work have you done with ESDCTA in the last few years? This is my second year as a member of ESDCTA. Last year I have served as the Club's representative for the NJ Equine Advisory Board, and this year I served as the Member at Large (Dressage). In addition, our business has sponsored shows and awards for several years, and we were presenters at Skylands Saddlery/ESDCTA Education Series.

Annie was an open show horse whose favorite event was barrels, and through a lot of hard work and hard falls, I turned her into an eventer - not an easy task since I was also on the steep part of the Eventing learning curve! I now compete a 13-yr-old TB mare, "Mickie," who I purchased from my research herd at Virginia Tech as a yearling. After years of squeezing training and competing into my busy schedule, we currently compete at Preliminary Level, and hope to one day compete in a 1-star event. Recently, I took on an off-the-track TB as a project horse; Skip is a 5-yr old 17-hh event prospect who is currently learning how to have fun being a horse. My other hobbies (when I'm not riding) include skiing, hiking, biking, rollerblading, and other nice-weather outdoor sports.

**2. What volunteer work have you done with ESDCTA in the last few years?**

I have been a member of the Eventing Committee for the past several years. I also encourage my Rutgers students to volunteer at ESDCTA events for "extra credit". This has helped greatly with staffing the NJ Horse Trials!

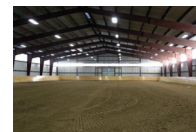



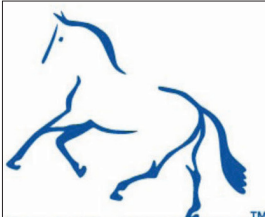
