DRESSAGE:

Qualifying Period: August 23, 2011, through August 23, 2012

Entry Opening Date: July 28, 2012 **Entry Closing Date:** August 20, 2012

Qualifying: One score earned at an ESDCTA-sanctioned schooling or recognized show published in the Omnibus or advertised in the ESDCTA newsletter.

- **One score of 60% or higher: Starter - W/T** (USDF-A or USDF-B), **Starter - W/T/C** (USDF-C or Tr. 1), **Training - Second Levels** (Test 2 or 3)
- **One score of 58% or higher: Third and Fourth Levels** (Test 2 or 3) and **FEI Levels**
- **Musical Freestyle** - All Levels - One ride of 60% or higher

Dressage Seat Equitation: Automatic through your one qualifying score or by riding in a DSE class and obtaining a minimum score of 68%

Tests that will be ridden at the Championship Show:

- **Starter - W/T:** USDF-A and USDF-B and Starter W/T/C: USDF-C and Training - 1
- **Training through Fourth Levels:** Tests 2 and 3 of the level
 - The two scores will be averaged to achieve a final score that will determine placing
- **FEI / MFS / DSE:** One ride at the qualifying level

EVENTING:

Qualifying Period: August 20, 2011, through August 20, 2012

Entry Opening Date: July 28, 2012 **Entry Closing Date:** August 20, 2012

Qualifying: One score, final maximum penalty of 50.00, earned at an ESDCTA-sanctioned USEA or schooling event/horse trials published in the Omnibus, advertised in the ESDCTA newsletter or at an USEA Recognized Horse Trials as follows:

- **Starter** - HT - 2'-2'3" ridden with Beginner Novice A or B Dressage Test
- **Beginner Novice** - HT - 2'7" ridden with Beginner Novice A or B Dressage Test
- **Novice** - HT - 2'11" ridden with Novice A or B Dressage Test
- **Training** - HT - 3'3" ridden with Training A or B Dressage Test

Dressage Tests that will be ridden at the Championship Show:

- **Starter** - 2'-2'3" - Dressage Test - 2010 Beginner Novice Test A
- **Beginner Novice** - 2'7" - Dressage Test - 2010 Beginner Novice Test B
- **Novice** - 2'11" - Dressage Test - 2010 Novice Test B
- **Training** - 3'3" - Dressage Test - 2010 Training Test B

CHAMPIONSHIP SHOW:

The ESDCTA Championship show is for members only - you had to be a member to qualify and must be a current member to participate. The qualifying horse and rider pairing must compete - no substitutions, Qualifying is based on Rider - not Horse. Due to scheduling constraints, competitors cannot compete in both the Dressage and Eventing Championships. Dressage competitors can complete in only one division. Dressage Starter Rider: if you qualified as a Starter Rider but rode over Training 1 during the year, you cannot compete as a Starter Rider - refer to Page 40 in the Omnibus for additional information.

There is still plenty of time to earn your qualifying scores. So, stay as cool as you can, ride well and see you in September.

Our Youth Have Been Busy

“WOW” CP Levels I and II Dressage and Jumping YRAP USEA Area II Camp 2012

WOW Camp 2012 was incredible. We had 88 campers and this was a true integrative effort, pooling resources and memberships to create opportunities for all of the campers. We had members from USPC, ESDCTA, The YRAP program from the USEA and the ICP program from the USEA. With all of the organizations working together, we were able to hold camp at an awesome facility – the NJ Horse Park.

It was truly a “WOW” experience. The quality of the instruction was amazing, and included Lynn Symansky, Hannah Sue Burnett, Kristen Smolze, Jennie Brannigan, Hillary Moses, Earlen Haven, Sarah Stinneford, Brittany Yard, Nick Hansen, August Torsilieri, and some Pony Club members who shared their recent testing experience and knowledge in the areas of their special interest. Campers had private dressage lessons and small, quality jumping groups, allowing all to take advantage of numerous XC opportunities. The camp allowed for mounted and unmounted instruction and ended with a final day where campers could participate in a Derby or just the fix-a-test portion of the Derby at the camper's choice. This was a terrific way for the campers to utilize their new skills in a competition format.

The fix-a-test had 2 judges in the 2 dressage arenas: Susan Jones-Sinelnik(r) and Barbara Ebner(S); and on XC Debbie Adams judged the participants on technical merit in the jumping phases. This gave the campers feedback in writing on their riding. The improvement of all the campers was extraordinary. WOW Camp 2013 is already in the planning phase and set for a July 2013 date!

Hoof Dissection and Pasture Walk

The USPC and ESDCTA also ran an unmounted cooperative day where members from both organizations participated at Clover Valley Farm with Farrier Ken Warren, who offered a discussion on various aspects of hoof care and preformed a dissection. This was a hands-on experience for all participants. Rutgers University also gave a pasture maintenance discussion informing all members about pasture quality and care. We want to thank Laura Gladny from Rutgers and Ken Warren for donating their time. This was a free lecture for our memberships and was a part of the educational awards program.

Region I Youth Team Competition

ESDCTA sent two teams to the Region 1 Youth Team Competition the end of July. Despite the competition being the last weekend in July, we really lucked out with the weather and had temperatures in the mid-80s both days with a steady breeze. This was much nicer than last year when we had temperatures in the 100s! On Friday, July 27, the seven riders and five horses headed down to Morven Park in Leesburg, Virginia. We got our horses settled in their stable and began decorating right away.

This year, we had decided on a Candy Shoppe Theme. Each horse's stall was a different type of candy, which really added color to our stable! After we finished decorating and our horses ate, we took them for a walk around the show grounds; they seemed very relaxed. Then we put them away and headed over to the driving dressage exhibition. We learned about the different types of driving and the roles of not only the driver, but the person on the back of the cart as well. We got to watch as they showed us some of their moves and explained to us how they would be judged. After we watched the driving, they explained the different phases of event driving. Following the exhibition, VADA/NOVA treated everyone to a pizza party. This was the first real time we got to hang out as a team and get to know one another.

Saturday started the actual competition. Everyone would ride one test Saturday and another on Sunday. Alexa DiCiurcio also chose to do a warm-up class where she got to ride a test before her “team” test. Despite her horse, Sunshine, getting a little strong, they managed to place 2nd in their warm-up class. All of the horses behaved nicely in their tests on Saturday and the team spirit was amazing. You'd halt and salute and hear applause not only from your family, but from all of the other ESDCTA riders and their families! No one ever complained and everyone was so supportive of one another. Jessie Kuc and Thunder were ESDCTA's high score pair of the day with a score of 68%.

After the competition on Saturday, all of us decided to hang out at the pool at our hotel. We finally got to “be kids” and hang out. After a while in the pool, we all went out to dinner while our parents all went to another place for dinner. We started this tradition a few years ago and it's so much fun to have time with only our teammates, where we can bond away from riding. We found a Baskin Robin's after dinner and eventually found our way back to the hotel, where all seven of us piled into one hotel room and watched the Olympic Games together. Even after a long night, everyone was cheerful the next morning for Sunday's competition.

Alexa entered Dressage Seat Equitation as an extra class, and she placed 1st. Jessie Kuc and Thunder and me on my pony, Rufus, entered the Musical Freestyle class. Jessie and Thunder did their First Level Elton John Freestyle and came in 3rd with a 65%. I was so proud of Rufus, as we did our Lady GaGa Third Level Freestyle and came in 5th with a 63%. Rufus and I were the only pair in the class not doing a First Level Freestyle so I was thrilled that he put his “A-game” on and was competitive with the others with his Third Level Freestyle.

Grace Schierwagen, and Alexa DiCiurcio, came in 3rd for our Mix Level Division. All of the scores in our division were very close and we were so happy to have moved up a placing from where we had been after the first day. The ESDCTA Sweethearts (Jessie Kuc, Haley Scheirwagen, and Ashley Coleman) placed 5th in the very competitive Training Level Division. Jessie and Thunder were ESDCTA's high score of Sunday and also were ESDCTA's highest combined score for the weekend. Rufus and I were ESDCTA's most improved tpair over the two days.

I was very happy to get to compete at this Competition once again. This was my eighth year being on an ESDCTA Youth Team. Morven Park is a gorgeous show grounds, and I always find it amazing how close of friends you become with your teammates. We all cheered each other on and everyone supported each other despite which team we were on. We were all from ESDCTA and that was all that mattered. I am very grateful that this competition offers mixed team divisions as it allowed me to bring Rufus at Third Level. Otherwise, we wouldn't have been able to come, as we were the only Third Level pair. We had a great mixed team of a Training Level ride, two First Level rides, and my Third Level tests, and we were able to be very competitive even with the team who had primarily Intro tests with one Training Level. Thank you ESDCTA for sending/sponsoring us, to our Chief De Equipe, Jill Kuc, and to our parents for making this happen for us.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT MEMBERSHIP DUES

The Board of Trustees wrestled with very tough issues this past month, including the decision to keep the hard copy newsletter and the Omnibus, the results of the membership's input, and renewed conversations about dues.

To ensure the membership continues to receive the many benefits ESDCTA already provides its members, the Board voted to raise dues. We have kept the increase nominal. Last year we subsidized the USDF increase so our members were not burdened with the total increase. The new dues structure eliminates that subsidy. The senior membership dues are now \$55, Family Memberships are \$65 and Youth Memberships are \$45. These increases are only about \$3 in each category.

The Board also decided to try a new, experimental membership level for people who do not care to compete in the ESDCTA Championships for awards. For \$40, they enjoy most member benefits minus the newsletter, which they can download on line, and the Omnibus, which they can purchase for \$15.

If you are a business wanting to reach our 700-plus members, our new business member package is \$150 a year. Businesses receive an ad in the newsletter; a listing on the web site, and a listing in the Omnibus. They also receive the newsletter mailed to their business, discounts for advertising, events and programs that other members receive, and a free Omnibus if they renew by December 1st.

In reviewing the various options, the Board also took stock of the member benefits and dues of other GMOs. Given our size and what we afford our members, the benefits list was competitive with other GMOS and continues to grow.

The membership renewal form is inserted in this issue. Please remember that renewals received by December 1 receive the Omnibus free of charge.

HORSE TREATS

With the London Olympics behind us, it's time to look at some interesting stories behind both past and present equestrian competitors.

2012: Kenki Sato, Japan

Kenki Sato, competed for Japan as an individual in eventing in London. While his round didn't go quite as planned, I'm sure he didn't let it get to him because Kenki is a Buddhist monk when he's not galloping cross-country. He is known for meditating for upwards of 19 hours a day. He resides at his family's Nagano temple near the site of the 1998 winter games. He says his religious discipline helps him in his riding. He told the Associated Press, "Before the competition starts I concentrate. I'm behaving more like a monk."

2008: Luiza Tavares de Almeida, Brazil

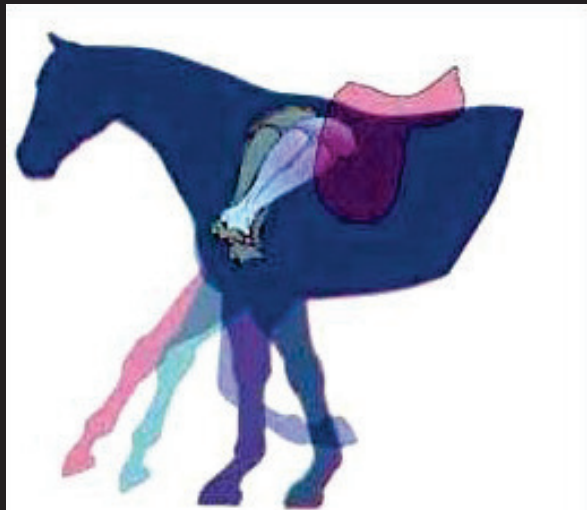
While most kids are only dreaming about being in the Olympics, Luiza was actually there in Beijing as a member of the Brazilian dressage team. She was only 16 when she competed in dressage on her 9-year-old Lusitano, Samba. She again represented Brazil as an individual, riding Pastor, at the 2012 London Olympics, finishing 47th.

1960: Bill Roycroft, Australia

This should be filed under "don't try this at home." During the Rome Olympics, Australia's Bill Roycroft broke his neck during the cross-country phase of team eventing. Not wanting to let his team down, he discharged himself from the hospital the next day and completed his show jumping round, helping Australia to clinch the gold medal. He also rode in the 1964, 1968, 1972, and 1976 games, and at the time of his death in 2011, he was Australia's oldest surviving Olympian at 96 years old.

1952: Lis Hartel, Denmark

There were no Paralympics when Lis Hartel won a silver medal in dressage at the Helsinki games. But she may have qualified, as she had been paralyzed from the knees down by polio eight years earlier; her arms and hands were also affected. At the competition, she had to be lifted on and off her horse, Jubilee. She was also the first woman to compete in dressage at the Olympics, since before these games, women were not allowed.

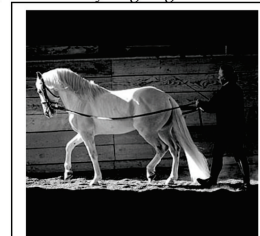
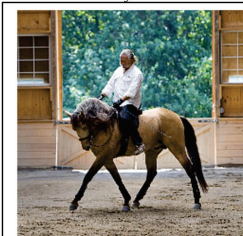

More Event Horse Nutrition!

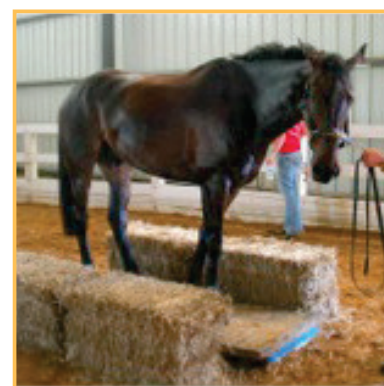
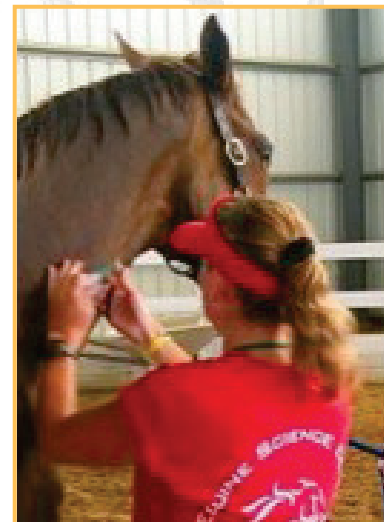
In the last article ("Event Horse Nutrition: What the Pro's Feed," April 2012) I discussed feeding management practices of riders competing in the Jersey Fresh CCI in 2006 and 2007. This article will detail more of the results from these studies, only this time we will look more into what the horses told us. These same riders who gave us details about what their horses were fed also gave us a chance to take a few blood samples from their horses (pictured to the right is me taking a blood sample after cross-country), along with a body weight (the other picture is of one of our subjects getting weighed on an electronic scale after cross-country) at three different time points during the course of the competition. Blood samples and body weight was taken after the first veterinary inspection, in the vet box about 30 minutes after cross-country and 18 to 24 hours after cross-country after the second veterinary inspection, but before stadium jumping. From the previously mentioned dietary data we estimated total dietary intake of vitamin E, potassium (K), calcium (Ca), phosphorus (P), and magnesium (Mg) based on each horse's weight and the nutrient content of each of the feeds and supplements. We also calculated recommended levels of each of the above based on the Nutrient Requirements for Horses (NRC publication, 2007).

The results showed that intakes of K (4-fold), P (2-fold), Ca (2-fold) and Mg (3-fold) were higher than recommended levels for horses of similar body weight in 'very heavy' exercise, which is the category that includes racing, endurance, and elite level eventing. Since no clinical signs of K toxicity were evident in the three-day event horses these high levels of K intake perhaps may not be physiologically relevant. Phosphorus intake, on the other hand, was twice the recommended level but still maintained the Ca:P of 2:1, therefore the high levels here might also not be high enough to be clinically relevant. The biggest problem would be the excess phosphorus that is passed out through the manure and then into the soil. This can create excess phosphorus in water runoff and potentially contaminate lakes and other waterways, which could lead to eutrophication or overgrowth of algae, killing fish and other wildlife. Another issue I see it is just wasted money! Over-supplementing definitely can hurt your pocket book and in this economy no one wants to waste money.

These horses also had an average vitamin E intake of about 1600 IU (International Units) per day, while fed at the competition, which does not include the amount consumed in the pasture when training at home. This level is almost twice recommended levels. If pasture was taken into account, this value would sure be higher because fresh green grass contains significantly more vitamin E (as well as other vitamins) than the same species of grass that has been sun-dried and dried for hay. Since vitamin E is not toxic, and up to 5-times the recommended level is actually recommended for horses that are prone to tying-up or other muscular conditions, there should not be an issue with this level of supplementation.

As for the blood samples we took, we found that horses in both the 2* and 3* divisions has a very similar blood profile when looking at various parameters of antioxidant status. After cross-country, 3* horses had higher serum creatine kinase (CK) and aspartate aminotransferase (AST; both are muscle enzymes that could possibly indicate muscle membrane leakage) than the 2* horses. This does make sense since they were working at a higher level (faster and longer XC course) than the 2* horses. Plasma beta-carotene was higher in the 2* horses compared to the 3* horses, which might have been because more of these horses were kept on pasture when they were housed at home (pasture is the number one source of beta-carotene). Red blood cell glutathione was also higher in the 2* versus 3* horses. This is interesting because as mentioned in the previous article about dietary supplements, the 2* horses were found to be receiving more antioxidant supplements and had longer access to fresh green pasture (again, the number one source for antioxidants for horses). Whether these amounts are enough to definitely increase antioxidant status is unknown, but it is a possibility given the current results.

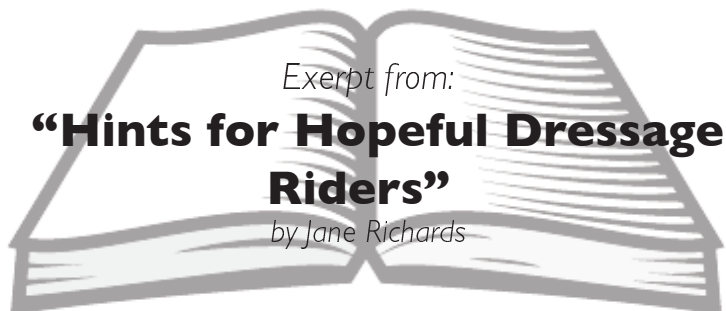

Hints for the Halt

Transitions from walk to halt and vice versa will help to obtain a correct halt. If horse and rider are balanced, a horse will often halt straight in front. Working on a square halt, where the weight is on all four feet equally, can be attained as the horse develops and training progresses. Straightness is important. At this stage, it really depends how your horse halts as to how much leg and rein pressure is needed.

- Think straight and look straight when asking for a halt.
- If the horse has a problem actually halting, then address this initially. When the horse understands that he must come to a stop, the finer points can then be developed, but in any event, try to keep him as straight as possible.
- With a horse that is very difficult, one may try turning him to face a wall or fence as you ask for the halt, at the same time using your voice and being gentle.
- Make sure you reward him with a pat when he tries to please.
- Some horses can be very nervous about halting in which case half halts may be beneficial. Also, do not worry about how and where he halts as long as he halts.
- Praise him and allow him to walk on. In some cases, feed him a treat when he halts, but do not make a habit of this!
- Never become impatient with a horse that is nervous about halting. You do not want him to rear with you. It may be helpful to work on the ground with him and/or have a person walk by your side while mounted.
- Some horses have a habit of coming to an abrupt halt. Half halts again will improve this problem, as after a few, the horse thinks that he will be asked to walk on again before he has actually halted and so will be thinking ‘forward’
- Equally important is your position when asking for the halt. Make sure that you are sitting in a relaxed, erect position with shoulders back and that your legs are not shooting forward. Your weight needs to remain evenly in the saddle.

Remember, the halt comes from the hind legs into the hand. It is not a “pulling back” of the reins. Your horse should not drop behind the bit or the vertical, or raise or shorten the neck once the halt has been perfected. If his head is in a more or less correct position in the walk, it should remain there through the halt. Once the halt has been perfected, then all that is needed is a soft leg at the girth and a closing of the fingers on the reins while sitting as quietly and as still as possible. If you find your hands do come back, your reins may be too long or your horse is not coming forward into the halt. Visualize and know in your mind how it should look and feel. If you asked your horse to “halt” using your voice, it should be a little drawn out, with him achieving the halt by the time you get to the ‘T’. As you ask for the halt, imagine using the voice. In the initial stages, you may want to use your voice along with the aids.

If your horse resists a little, once halted, keep a light, even contact and wait until he submits. A gentle squeezing alternately with the right and left reins will help him to soften his feel on the bit, and always remember to reward him with a pat or a kind word. If you feel the tendency to step back, then proceed in walk. It may be for a variety of reasons, including too much rein aid or that he just felt like taking a step back. In any case, just calmly walk on and ask again for the halt. If this is a habit of his, then half halts will help. Simply put, as your horse comes to the halt, change your mind and quietly walk on a few times. Then ask again for the halt. If you consistently have a problem, trot your horse around for a moment and return to the halt later in the session. Try halting your horse on the trails where he may be a bit more relaxed.





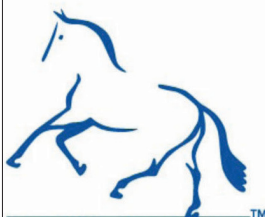
