DEFINITIONS/ELIGIBILITY:

JR/YR – Riders are eligible to compete in these classes until the end of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 21. FEI JR Tests - only riders ages 14-18. FEI YR Tests - only riders ages 16-21. FEI Pony Tests - only riders ages 12-16. FEI Children Tests - only riders ages 12-14. Include birth date on entry.

AA – Adult Amateur – Individuals possessing current amateur certification are only eligible as AA from the beginning of the calendar year in which they turn 22. Only active USEF members may obtain amateur status.

PE – Para Equestrian – Riders must have a current USEF Dispensation Certificate which indicates their classification status to be eligible. All tests in standard arena.

CBLM – Colonel Bengt Ljungquist Memorial Championship qualifying class for 2024. Riders must be member of a participating GMO at the time of the show to be eligible.

USDF Q – Qualifying class for 2025 GAIG/USDF Regional Championships. Declare qualifying ride on entry form and pay additional \$20 qualifying fee prior to start of class.

Rules Governing the Col. Bengt Ljungquist Memorial Championships Finals

- 1. The same tests used to qualify will be used in the Finals, except the FEI Children Pony, Junior & Young Rider tests listed above.
- 2. The tests must be ridden from memory and without whips.
- 3. No horse/rider team may ride Hors de Concours in a Finals class.
- 4. Entries for the Finals classes may be made online (www.horseshowoffice.com) or mailed (received by the closing date) to the current year's Finals Entry Secretary, Ellen Clark along with all payments and necessary documents.
- 5. A horse/rider team may qualify at more than one level and all qualified horse/rider teams are permitted to compete in the Finals in consecutive qualified levels; this includes the corresponding Freestyle finals.
- 6. Only ONE horse/rider combination may show in the Finals. If two riders qualify the same horse at different levels, the choice must be made and only one Finals horse/rider combination will be accepted by the Finals Show Secretary (exception: Pas de Deux).
- 7. During the Finals competition, no horse entered in a Ljungquist Final may be ridden by anyone other than the rider entered in the Final on that horse until that combination has finished their Finals class(es); this includes the awards ceremony. (At this point, the new horse/rider combination may compete in open classes with new entry form and bridle number.)
- 8. Training Level and First Level Finals for Senior/YR riders will consist of two divisions: a) riders who have not competed at or above Third Level at a USEF licensed show, and b) riders who have competed at or above Third Level at a USEF licensed show.
- 9. Second and Third Level Finals for senior (and/or YR) riders will consist of two divisions: a) riders who have not competed at or above the FEI Prix St. Georges level or in any of the FEI Young Rider levels at an USEF licensed show, and b) riders who have competed at or above the FEI Prix St. Georges level or in any of the FEI Young Rider levels at an USEF licensed show.
- 10. Fourth Level Finals for senior riders will consist of two divisions: a) riders who have not competed at or above the FEI Intermediate I at a USEF licensed show, and b) riders who have competed at or above the FEI Intermediate I at a USEF licensed show.
- 11. Prix St Georges Finals for senior riders will consist of two divisions: a) riders who have not competed at or above the FEI Intermediate II at a USEF licensed show, and b) riders who have competed at or above the FEI Intermediate II and/or B at a USEF licensed show.
- 12. A Division A rider may compete in Division B, but a Division B rider may NOT compete in Division A.
- 13. Regardless of the Division entered, only ONE Level per entrant (A or B, not both) may be ridden in at the Championships.
- 14. The Pas de Deux Finals class MUST be held on Sunday of the Finals Competition.
- 15. Finalists are NOT required to be stabled on grounds.
- 16. The Championship competition is to be held within USDF Region 1 only.

Awards Ceremony

Riders placing in Col. Bengt Ljungquist Memorial Championship classes must be present, mounted and in full riding attire for awards ceremonies (Ten places for Training & First (excluding MFS), ten places for all the rest of the Championship classes). Failure, without prior permission of the competition manager, in consultation with the Technical Delegate, the Awards Coordinator, to be present and properly attired will eliminate the official score and placing and the next highest score will move up in placing. In the case of inclement weather, unmounted ceremonies may be held.

Awards Ceremony Schedule:

A tentative schedule for the Awards Ceremonies will be printed in the "Show Program" and the official schedule will be posted in the show secretary's office by noon on the day prior to the beginning of the competition & on www.horseshowoffice.com and www.esdcta.org

Garden State Classic Information

AWARDS:

- Open show: Trophy & ribbons to sixth place in all classes with 3 or more per division. Ribbon for classes with only 1.
- **Championship classes**: Special award to Champion, prize money to Champion (\$200) & Reserve (\$100); ribbons to 10th for Training & First Levels (excludes freestyles), ribbons to 8th all other levels. Prize money will be mailed within 14 days of end of show. Awards ceremony schedule will be in the Program and will be posted on www.horseshowoffice.com
 - Separate finals classes are offered for Junior riders at Training, First and Second levels and Junior/Young Riders at Third and Fourth levels (excluding Freestyles). Young Riders must compete in the appropriate Senior division at Training, First and Second levels. If there are 3 or more Junior/ Young Riders at any of the FEI levels (excluding Freestyles), Junior/Young Riders will be pinned by division for the corresponding level(s).
- Garden State Classic Show High Score Awards for each level & division: Open, AA & Jr/YR for Training, First, Second, Third, Fourth, FEI, MFS
- Amy Parsons Memorial Award Saturday Highest AA Score for 60 & over. Prize & \$100 cash.
- Breed High Score Awards Including: TBA

USEF Rule DR129.9: Except for USEF/USDF Championship classes and for FEI Pony Riders, FEI Junior and FEI Young Rider Freestyles, in order to enter a freestyle class at any level, a horse/rider combination must have received a minimum score of 63% for Training through Fourth levels and 60% for FEI levels in the highest test of the declared freestyle level or any test of a higher level at a Federation /USDF Licensed Dressage Competition or FEI recognized Dressage Competition or "open" Dressage class (i.e. open to all breeds) at a Federation Licensed Competition held prior to the competition where the horse/rider combination is entered to ride a freestyle class. To enter an FEI Para Dressage Freestyle class, © USEF 2022 DR -59 a horse/rider combination must have received a minimum score of 60% in any FEI Para Dressage test (Introductory, Novice, Team, Individual) at the rider's classified Grade. This score may be earned at a USEF/USDF licensed Dressage Competition or FEI recognized Dressage Competition or "open" Dressage class (i.e. open to all breeds) at a Federation Licensed Competition held prior to the competition where the horse/rider combination is entered to ride a freestyle class. A photocopy of the test verifying eligibility, or copy of the USDF score verification, must be submitted with the entry for a freestyle class. All FEI Pony Rider Tests are equivalent to Second Level; all FEI Junior Tests are equivalent to Third Level; all FEI Young Rider Tests are equivalent to PSG; and the USEF Brentina Cup (Young Adult) Test and FEI Young Rider Grand Prix 16-25 Tests are equivalent to Intermediate II. For purposes of freestyle qualification, all are considered equivalent to the highest test of that level and may be used to enter a freestyle at that level or a level below. Young Horse and FEI Children Tests cannot be used for freestyle qualification at any level.

STABLING:

Permanent 10 X 10 stalls, 10' overhang wood walls with chainlink tops, and full doors. Bedding should be ordered in advance (\$12.00). No initial bedding. Please order your extra bedding with entry. There will be a limited quantity of extra bedding available at the show and it will be \$13.00 per bag.

Stabling is limited and are on a first-come basis and tack stalls may be rescinded if horse stalls run out.

DO NOT put <u>any</u> items in empty stalls. Doing so will result in you being billed for a tack stall.

Full hookups (electric and water) on grounds, no dump station. Indicate rig length and breaker amp (20, 30, 50 amps available) on entry form.

Entry Information:

Entry Information Requirements: Competitors are responsible to provide valid membership numbers on the entry form for all horse, owner, rider, and trainer names listed on the entry form. USEF and USDF registration is verified electronically if valid membership numbers are provided on the entry form. Safe Sport Training must have been completed for USEF membership to be valid. You may be asked to provide copies of your membership documents if your memberships cannot be verified for any reason.

No horse will be permitted on the grounds without a valid health certificate or proof of vaccinations (Equine Influenza Virus & Equine Herpes Virus (Rhinopneumonitis) within 6 months prior to arriving. Rule GR845

SAFE SPORT TRAINING is required for all **riders**, **owners and trainers and coaches** within 30 days of membership. If Safe Sport Training has not been completed within 30 days of membership, entries will not be accepted until proof of completion is provided. If membership is renewed during show, Safe Sport Training must be completed within 30 days or results will be nullified. **Parents of minors who are signing as trainer on USEF entries must have a current USEF Competing membership and must have completed safesport training.**

Entries must be received by Midnight of the closing date. Any entry still requiring a signature, payment, or copies of proof of valid membership (including Safe Sport Training) by August 17th will be considered

incomplete and will incur a late paperwork penalty fee of \$30. No refunds after closing date, for any reason.

- All fees must be paid in US funds. Fees must be paid with entry. Entries not accompanied by fees will be considered late and not entered until fees are received including any late or post entry fees. Returned checks will nullify entry until debt is satisfied. Returned check fee is \$50.
- Entries submitted after closing date will be considered late, see below.
- Numbers will not be given out until entries have been submitted to the show AND owners, riders and coaches or trainers have signed all entry blanks.
- Only one horse-rider combination per entry form.
- Management reserves the right to cut off entries prior to closing date if show is full.

Late Entries: Late entries may be accepted after the closing date if space is available, upon payment of an additional late entry fee of \$50. All late entries must enter and pay online – email for late entry permission.

Policy for Class Changes and Filling Scratches in classes: Must be eligible for class. Must have previously entered in competition as a competing or non-competing horse.

Para-Equestrian competitors and their horses are no longer exempt from USDF memberships. Para-Equestrian competitors will now be required to have a USDF participating or group membership or a Non Member fee will apply. All horses will need a life or HID USDF membership.

Day Trailer parking: Pay per day parking fee and park in areas designated by show management.

Musical Freestyles: Music must be on good quality CD or submitted electronically with entry. Sound check will be on Friday evening or early Saturday morning, check with show office. Competitor is responsible for attending sound check to make sure music works properly and for picking up their music at the end of the show.

Numbers must be worn at all times when a horse is being walked, exercised or ridden. All competitors must check into the show office even if they have their number.

Show Management reserves the right to vary or add officials and refuse any entry for a cause; to disqualify any exhibitor and/or his or her horse for cause; to cause an exhibitor to forfeit his or her ribbons and winnings for cause; to return any entry and/or stall fee before or during the show for cause; all without being liable for damage or compensation. Show management reserves the right to make any changes deemed necessary for the safe and efficient conduct of this competition.

Weather/Acts of God/Accidents or Emergency Policy: Management reserves the right to cancel any classes due to hazardous weather, Acts of God, Accidents or Emergencies. Every effort will be made to reschedule with priority given to USEF Program classes. No refunds for cancellations due to hazardous weather, Acts of God, Accidents or Emergencies.

No Shows: All "No Shows" that have not contacted the show office will be considered a scratch for the rest of the show and time slots may be filled. Exhibitors enter with this understanding and agreement.

"Attention Competitors as of January 1, 2019, if you are a USEF competing member 18 years of age or older you are required to take the core Safe Sport training within 14 days of activating our membership. Take the Safe Sport Training at USEF.org by logging into your member dashboard."

Membership/Registration Requirements for GAIG/USDF Qualifying Classes: Riders must be current USDF Participating members & USEF members (Junior, Senior or Life) in good standing and this included Safe Sport Training. Horses must be USDF Lifetime Registered and USEF Annual or Lifetime Recorded. Horses with only an HID are not eligible. Owners must be current USDF Participating or Business members & USEF members (Junior, Senior or Life) in good standing. For current Great American/USDF Championship requirements, go to www.usdf.org/competitions/competitionschampionships/regionals/index.asp.

Great American/USDF Qualifying Classes: Please indicate that the class is to count for qualifying by placing a Q after the class number. Class fee plus additional \$20 fee must be paid prior to start of the class. Qualifying will not require a separate ride. See USDF 2025 GAIG/USDF Regional Championship Program Rules pages for membership requirements.

Show Schedule and Ride Time Conflicts: It is the responsibility of the rider to inform the management of any time conflicts as soon as possible after receiving the schedule.

Additional Stabling Information:

- Stable Group: Please list stable group on entry form and use only one group name for each stable group to ensure that your group will be stabled together.
- Stalls will be ready to use by 12:00 pm on Wednesday.
- Any stall changes MUST be cleared with show office.
- Trailer-ins must pay daily grounds fee and park in designated areas.
- No exhibitor may withdraw horses from a licensed show after it has commenced or remove them from the showgrounds without permission of the show secretary or show manager.

• Lungeing in designated areas only.

Pets: Dogs must be on leashes or otherwise restrained AT ALL TIMES while on show grounds, including in the stable area and NO pets are allowed inside coliseum. Dog owners are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from their dogs' behaviors. Dogs should not be kenneled overnight in the stable area. Dog owners failing to comply will be issued a Yellow warning card and non-compliance may result in further USEF penalties.

Membership Statement:

Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Modified Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A non-member may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, or agent at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a Show Pass fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes

Safe Sport Reminder:

Reminder: All USEF Life and Senior Active members, as well as participants who have regular contact with minor athletes, are required to comply with the U.S. Center for SafeSport training requirement to be eligible to participate in the competition. All participants must adhere to the U.S. Center for SafeSport Code, USEF Safe Sport Policy, and the Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies. More information about these can be found at www.usef.org.

Motorized Vehicle Statement:

Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for penalties against those responsible for the child committing the offense. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

The unsafe use of personal electronic transport devices, as determined by the competition officials and management in their sole discretion, that do not require a driver's license to operate, including but not limited to segways, hover boards, and single wheeled scooters is prohibited on competition grounds. Operating such devices in areas where people gather may be deemed "unsafe use" if there is a risk of harm to others. If the operator of the device is a minor, the parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating the device in violation of this rule is accountable and may be subject to penalties. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

<u>USDF Membership Benefits:</u> USDF is dedicated to education, the recognition of achievement, and promotion of dressage. For details on member benefits, including educational programs, awards, and other opportunities, refer to the *USDF Member Guide* or the USDF website at www.usdf.org.

Membership Requirements for USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized Competitions:

Owners and riders, including foreign riders

and owners who are not residents of the US, wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition as a rider or owner/lessee, must have either a USDF Group Membership (GM), Participating Membership (PM), or have a USDF Non-Member (NM) identification number and pay the USDF Non-Member (NM) fee. (Note: USDF Business Members can own horses but cannot compete as riders with their USDF Business Membership.)

Horses competing at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions must have either a USDF Horse Identification (HID) number or a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR). Proper credentials or verification certificates must be presented to the competition secretary.

Riders and owners wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition, and not able to present the competition secretary with verification of a USDF membership or NM identification, and USDF LHR or USDF HID, must complete a USDF Competition Affidavit Form and pay the \$5 affidavit filing fee. A copy of a completed affidavit form from another competition may also be used for verification purposes for up to 60 days. (Exception: Affidavits cannot be used at Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championships.)

Exceptions:

- Horses competing only in Individual Breed Classes (IBCs) at DSHB competitions, sires and dams of horses in DSHB group classes, where those
 sires or dams are not actually competing in the same competition, horses competing only in breed restricted dressage or DSHB classes at
 Regular Competitions (e.g. all Arabian, all Friesian, or all Morgan classes), or in USDF Introductory Level tests, pas de deux or quadrille, are
 exempt from this requirement. Also exempt are horses ridden in leadline, exhibitions, games and races, classes for 4-H members, walk-trot,
 academy, and opportunity classes.
- Riders and owners/lessees competing only in classes which are exempt from the USDF HID requirements are also exempt from the USDF NM
 identification number and NM fee requirements. Also exempt are handlers of horses competing in DSHB In-Hand or Group classes.

Memberships Defined

Participating Membership (PM): A membership issued to an individual directly by USDF. The membership year is December 1 through November 30. PMs are available for 1-year (\$100), 5-years (\$400), or life (\$2,000). A USDF Youth Participating Membership (YPM) is available for individuals who have not reached their 21st birthday by December 1 of the current membership year (\$80). A PM allows the member to compete at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions and to participate as a rider and/or owner/lessee for all Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards and the Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championship program.

Group Membership (GM): A membership issued to an individual by USDF when the member name and dues are submitted to USDF through an affiliate Group Member Organization (GMO). The GM year begins December 1 and ends November 30. A GM allows the member to compete at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions and participate in the USDF Rider Awards Program.

Business Membership (BM): A membership that runs December 1 through November 30 and is issued to a business or organization directly by USDF. The USDF BM (\$280) offers a wider variety of advertising benefits. BMs satisfy requirements of horse ownership only.

Non-Member (NM) Identification Number: For each USDF NM owner/lessee and USDF NM rider there will be a USDF NM fee of \$55 per competition that must be collected by the show secretary and submitted to USDF, along with the USDF Report of Fees document and the \$5 affidavit fee and Competition Affidavit Form if the person cannot provide a copy of their USDF NM card. Owners/lessees or riders exempt from the NM number requirements are also exempt from paying the USDF NM fee. If there are multiple owners of a horse and all are NMs, only one of the owners must pay the NM fee. If the horse has at least one owner who is a current USDF PM, GM, or BM there is no NM fee assessed. Competition management will be invoiced for all applicable USDF NM fees not received with the USDF post-competition paperwork, along with a report listing all USDF NMs. Competition management is then required to submit the NM fees within 30 days to the USDF. An individual with a USDF NM identification number is not eligible for any USDF membership benefits. Once a USDF NM number has been assigned, a USDF NM card can be obtained from the USDF website.

Horse Identification (HID) Number: A one-time tracking number for horses (\$45). Scores earned by a horse with an HID number will be recorded but will NOT be counted towards Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards. A horse with an HID number is not eligible to compete in Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying or championship classes. An HID number can be upgraded to a Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) for a fee of \$95. If a horse has a USDF LHR it does not need an HID number. An HID number is a one-time fee that does not need to be renewed.

Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR): A horse with an LHR (\$140) is eligible for Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards, and eligible to compete in Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying and championship classes, assuming requirements for the owner and rider are met. If a horse has an LHR it does not need an HID number. An LHR does not need to be renewed.

How to Join USDF

Applications for USDF Participating Membership (PM), Business Membership (BM), Horse Identification (HID) number, and Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) may be found in the following locations:

- On the USDF website: www.usdf.org. You can submit the application online or download the form.
- In the show office at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions classified by USEF as Dressage Competitions, and Regular Competitions which are open to all breeds.

The effective date of membership is the date the form and correct fees are received in the USDF office or, if applying at a competition, the date accepted by the competition secretary, provided the application is signed and dated by the competition secretary, member, and/or horse owner on that same day.



2025 Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championships

A single Regional Dressage Championship program organized by the United States Dressage Federation (USDF), and recognized by the United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. (USEF), will be held in each of the nine USDF regions. In addition, Alaska and Hawaii may each hold state championships if an official request from a Group Member Organization (GMO) is received by April 1 of the prior year. The Regional Championship Program Rules can be found on the USDF website at www.usdf.org. Please refer to the 2025 USDF Member Guide for the comprehensive list of rules and requirements for this program.

Membership/Registration Requirements for Qualifying and Championships

All memberships and registrations/recordings must be correct and current at the time qualifying scores are earned and at the time of the championships.

Rider:

- Must have a USDF Participating* Membership (PM).
- Must have a USEF membership (Active or Life).

Horse:

- Must have a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR).
- Must have a USEF (Annual or Lifetime) Horse Recording.
- USDF horse registration and USEF horse recording must be in the name(s) of the current owner(s) or lessee(s). A horse is not required to have breed registry papers.
- Horses must be entered in qualifying and championship classes under their official recorded names and ownership as specified in USEF GR1102.3, and transfers of ownership or lease registrations must be completed in compliance with USEF rules GR1105 and GR1108 prior to the competition in order for the horse to compete under the name of the new owner or lessee. (USEF DR127.2)

Owner:

- Must have a USDF Participating or Business Membership and a USEF membership (Active or Life Membership or Annual or Life Recorded Farm/Business). If the horse has more than one owner, at least one owner must have both active USEF membership and active USDF Participating or Business Membership and must be the owner of record with USEF and USDF.
 For a business or farm to be the valid owner under this requirement, it must be listed as an owner of the horse with both USEF and USDF.
- * PMs are USDF members who join USDF directly. USDF Group Members (GM) are ineligible.

Minimum Qualifying Scores: One set of nationally-standardized qualifying scores has been established for all USEF/USDF Regional Championships, for Training Level through Grand Prix, in three divisions: open, adult amateur and junior/young rider. The minimum percentages are as follows:

ACKNOWLEDGEMENT OF RISK: I knowingly, willingly, and voluntarily acknowledge the inherent risks associated with the sport of equestrian and know that horseback riding and related equestrian activities are inherently dangerous, and that participation in any equestrian activity involves risks and dangers including, without limitation, the potential for serious bodily injury (including broken bones, head or neck injuries), sickness and disease (including communicable diseases), trauma, pain & suffering, permanent disability, paralysis and death; loss of or damage to personal property (including my mount & equipment) arising out of the unpredictable behavior of horses; exposure to extreme conditions and circumstances, accidents involving other participants, event staff, volunteers or spectators; contact or collision with other participants and horses, natural or manmade objects; adverse weather conditions; facilities issues and premises conditions; failure of protective equipment (including helmets); inadequate safety measures; participants of varying skill levels; situations beyond the immediate control of The Horse Park organizers and competition management; and other undefined, not readily foreseeable and presently unknown risks and dangers ("Risks"), as well as the risks inherent to any event where exposure to COVID 19 exists.

EQUINE ACTIVITY LIABILITY ACT WARNING:

CAUTION: HORSEBACK RIDING AND EQUINE ACTIVITIES CAN BE DANGEROUS. RIDE AT YOUR OWN RISK.

Under the laws of most states, an equine activity sponsor or equine professional is not liable for any injury to, or the death of, a participant in equine activities resulting from the inherent risks of equine activities.

- C. ASSUMPTION OF RISK: I understand that the aforementioned Risks may be caused in whole or in part or result directly or indirectly from the negligence of my own actions or inactions, the actions or inactions of others participating in the Horse Park event, or the negligent acts or omissions of the Released Parties defined below, and I hereby voluntarily and knowingly assume all such Risks and responsibility for any damages, liabilities, losses, or expenses that I incur as a result of my participation in any Horse Park Events. I also agree to be responsible for any injury or damage caused by me, my horse, my employees or contractors under my direction and control at any Horse Park event. I also understand the risks related to attending an event in any capacity where other people are or have been present during the COVID 19 pandemic and I hereby voluntarily and knowingly assume all such risks and responsibility related thereto.
- D. WAIVER AND RELEASE OF LIABILITY, HOLD HARMLESS AND INDEMNITY: In conjunction with my participation in any Horse Park Event, I hereby release, waive, and covenant not to sue, and further agree to indemnify, defend and hold harmless the following parties: members, Event participants (including athletes/riders, coaches, trainers, judges/officials, and other personnel), the Event owner, and competition managers; the promoters, sponsors, or advertisers of any Horse Park Event; any charity or other beneficiary which may benefit from the Horse Park Event; and all directors, officers, employees, agents, contractors, and volunteers of any of the aforementioned parties, and specifically The Horse Park (Individually and Collectively, the "Released Parties" or "Event Organizers"), with respect to any liability, claim(s), demand(s), cause(s) of action, damage(s), loss, or expense (including court costs and reasonable attorney fees) of any kind or nature ("Liability") which may arise out of, result from, or relate in any way to my presence at or any activity related, directly or indirectly to participation in any Horse Park, including claims for Liability caused in whole or in part by the negligent acts or omissions of the Released Parties.
- E.: COMPLETE AGREEMENT AND SEVERABILITY CLAUSE: This Agreement represents the complete understanding between the parties regarding these issues and no oral representations, statements or inducements have been made apart from this Agreement. If any provision of this Agreement is held to be

unlawful, void, or for any reason unenforceable, then that provision shall be deemed severable from this Agreement and shall not affect the validity and enforceability of any remaining provisions.

I HAVE CAREFULLY READ THIS DOCUMENT IN ITS ENTIRETY, UNDERSTAND ALL OF ITS TERMS AND CONDITIONS, AND KNOW IT CONTAINS AN ASSUMPTION OF RISK, RELEASE AND WAIVER FROM LIABILITY, AS WELL AS A HOLD HARMLESS AND INDEMNIFICATION OBLIGATIONS.

By signing below, I (as the participant or as the Parent/Legal Guardian of the minor identified below) hereby accept and agree to the terms and conditions of this Agreement in connection with my (or the minor's) participation in any Horse Park Event. If, despite this Agreement, I, or anyone on my behalf or the minor's behalf, makes a claim for Liability against any of the Released Parties, I will indemnify, defend and hold harmless each of the Released Parties from any such Liabilities as the result of such claim. I understand and acknowledge that I will be required to present a copy of this waiver and release every time I enter upon Horse Park property, and I will retain a copy for that purpose.

The parties agree that this agreement may be electronically signed. The parties agree that the electronic signatures appearing on this agreement are the same as handwritten signatures for the purposes of validity, enforceability and admissibility.
